The *town* has *character*, and Wally, well; he *is a character* like no other. For many years, Wally was tourism in Eureka. When **Chris** and I came to town on a scouting trip, he showed us around and I was hooked.

Our groups were treated to entertainment in the Opera House, lunch with the local seniors, and Wally's famous tours. First was the "house" tour. You know, the Opera **House** and the Court **House**. Second was the "city tour." Since the town is only about six blocks long, it isn't an all-day affair... The Owl Club is where you play slots or drink at the bar, there's a small grocery, a smaller drug store, an antique store, a bunch of empty store fronts.

Then, after lunch, we would have the *cemetery tour*. Seriously, the first two tours on this page are really interesting. The "houses" are full of history and the little town is quirky as heck. But friends, let me tell you, the *cemetery tour* is the crown jewel. While Wally walks you among the headstones and final resting places of Eureka's dearly beloved and recently (or not so recently) departed, he narrates.

This isn't your *usual* narration. "John was the town banker. He was a community leader and helped build the Opera House." Wouldn't that be lovely? Except Wally isn't into that type of narration. More like, "John was the town banker, until he absconded with \$60,000 and left with Mrs. Brown, the grocer's wife. And here, right over here, is Barkley Jones. You notice all the others in the Jones family are buried there (pointing to a corner of the assembled plots). They hated Barkley, so when he died, they made sure they had nothing to do with him. That's why he's buried on the other side of the cemetery. Then there's Mrs. Ackerman, right here. She was a 'housekeeper,' or so they said. Her son sure is the spitting image of the town mortician. How could *that* be?" More scandal, you can bet Wally has the scoop.

By the end of the tour, you feel like you just watched Ellen, Dr. Phil and Saturday Night Live. **You have truly met the locals** once you finish walking among the headstones.

I didn't know Wally would even be in town. Last I heard he was buying a camper and heading out to see the world when he retired. For reasons I'm hopeful I'll hear about some day, he was back in Eureka.

It's possible the folks on the trip may have noticed the tear in my eye or the crack in my voice when my friend showed up to say hi. Or when he starting telling a couple members of our group about the cemetery tour and I broke out laughing *really* loud.

Maybe the best part of being a traveler for most of your life is the people you meet on the journey. Ain't many like Wally Cuchine. Now that I think about it, there isn't anyone. He's the real deal. Be well Wally. See you soon.

Your money is safe with us. We operate in full compliance with the California Seller of Travel Law which states ALL your payments are securely kept in escrow until the tour operates and returns.

We WILL travel the continent and world again. It is a cherished desire, a basic need, a human right!

We've weathered and survived many storms in the past 42 years... we'll survive this one, too.

Thank you most sincerely for your ongoing and unwavering friendship, support, trust and faith in us and what we do. Truly it means the world to Mark and me, and our entire staff.

As part of our commitment to helping you select the right tour for your interests and physical abilities, check out the Activity Meter for each tour to get a feel for how it matches your interests, energy and fitness. It's important to note that more than one level may apply to a tour. For example, some will enjoy a visit to a national park by spending time in the visitor's center and taking a seat with a view. Others might prefer to hike on a nature trail. Same destination, same tour, two different levels of activity.

The letter abbreviations for each departure can be found in the Table of Contents listing for the tour. Where you see two letters, that indicates the ability to add activities or do optional things which increase the amount of physical activity (standing, walking, climbing stairs, etc.). The meter is a guideline. It is impossible to predict every situation on tour, since conditions may change before or during a trip which require itinerary adjustments.

Leisurely – A tour that can be enjoyed by all. A minimal amount of required walking on city streets or generally level surfaces, with few stairs. A theater day trip might be an example.

Moderate – A tour with some walking activities, and standing/strolling at attractions and museums and possibly some stair climbing. A daytrip to the ballpark or a short regional trip (Monterey, CA Coast) might be examples. A moderate trip could include air transportation and navigating through airports.

Active – A tour which includes longer walks (3-5 city blocks). Shorter walks could be on uneven surfaces. Days could be longer (including longer travel days with layovers). Some of the trips could be at high altitudes.

This would be the level for most of our longer distance domestic and Canadian tours, the minimum level for an overseas international tour. Tours which mention the ability to walk 3-5 city blocks **in a timely fashion** a couple of times a day fit into this category, as would most of our national park tours. You could find a flight of stairs without handrails. A tour with a seaplane or jeep ride, and the ability to climb into the plane/jeep, would be found in this category. Longer rail tours fit in this category.


Energetic – A tour with an accent on opportunities for walking and other physical activities. Many overseas tours would fit in this category. Long plane flights, perhaps standing or walking longer distances. You might have to climb into a boat, carriage or train. If you need wheelchair assistance at the airport or other places, you should not consider a tour on this level.

Challenging – Tours like these are designed with daily physical activities like hiking and other vigorous activities and can be great travel experiences, but they are not typical of Sports Leisure Vacations trips.





Needles is our final destination for the evening. Join us for a casual dinner, with a discussion of some of the attractions and landmarks we will see on the remainder of our journey. BW Colorado River Inn (L,D)

2. During the Dust Bowl Days of the 30's, a horrible drought in the Midwest sent people west in search of food, jobs and a better life. They entered California by crossing a

bridge over the Colorado River on Route 66... if they had \$5 in their pockets. Hear the story and head off to Goffs, where an old schoolhouse serves as the backdrop for more Route 66 history. A little known general, Patton was his name, established a training camp here in WWII. One of the groups trained here landed at Normandy. The Route 66 Museum in Victorville is a

End the day in San Bernardino, where you will have a choice of accommodations. Stay in a regular hotel, or spend the night in a Wigwam! There are two of these hotels on 66, and tonight, you can make your home in one if you wish (some limitations on type of accommodations, inquire at registration). We'll gather everyone together tonight for a great dinner in a landmark Route 66 eatery, The Magic Lamp, in Rancho Cucamonga. Wigwam Motel or Comfort Inn Fontana (B.L.D)

3. The McDonald Brothers first had a restaurant in Arcadia, then moved to San Bernardino, which is where the modernday fast food concept was born. Would vou believe Taco Bell, founded by Thomas Bell, was also born in San Bernardino? Visit the McDonald's Museum before traveling across suburban Los Angeles. Past Santa Anita Racetrack and onto the "Rose Parade street," Colorado Boulevard, into Pasadena, then taking what seems like a back road into downtown Los Angeles, but believe it or not this really is the Original Route 66. Sunset Boulevard, is the way to travel into Hollywood on the old road, and we've arranged for a theater tour at the home of the Oscars. Hilton Garden Inn -Hollywood (B,L)



4. Past the studios of Hollywood and the luxury of Beverly Hills and on to the coast. The original 66 ended in downtown Los Angeles. It wasn't until 1936, ten years after the road opened, that it was extended out to Santa Monica. Enjoy time on the pier this morning, before doubling back to the Farmer's Market for lunch and free time to browse. Arrive at the airport mid-afternoon, in time for your 5pm flight home. (F,L)

Carson & Virginia

A Tale of Two "Cities" 3 Days • May 20-22

The Capital City of Nevada, Carson City began as a stopover for California bound emigrants, but developed into a major city with the discovery of silver in the mountains. It's been the state capital since 1864. **Virginia City** developed virtually overnight as a boomtown as a result of the silver strike in the region.

1. Arrive at our office via your home pickup and board your bus for Carson City.

There's a break for lunch at a popular Basque-style restaurant in Gardnerville. The Stewart School is one of many where Native Americans were educated from 19890-1990. Now on the National Register of Historic Places, the school represents a huge piece of local history. Your tour includes a chance to interact with a native guide. Following the tour and a refreshment break, arrive at the Gold Dust West Casino Hotel. This evening, meet a famous local visitor... (L)

2. After a short walking tour to meet some of Carson City's ghosts, head to Virginia City, called the Queen of the Comstock. The silver boom started in 1859 and lasted


almost two decades, driving the population to almost 18,000 people. Today, only a few hundred residents live here. Your visit features a trolley tour of town. End the day with dinner back in Carson City. (B,D)

3. A docent meets us at the Nevada State **Museum,** to bring all the history to life. There's even a stamping press from the old Carson City Mint. After lunch in Reno, head home via I-80. (B,L)

Spend 8 full days exploring the rich diversity of people, from the Indigenous cultures to the Irish seafarers to the oil industry workers of today. As we travel from the west coast to the east, keep your eyes open for moose; along the shoreline watch for the icebergs; in Bulls Bay visit the wildlife sanctuary for puffins and other seabirds. The island is populated with folks who love to sing and tell stories so we will join them on four different occasions to share some music, food and stories.

- 1-2. Can I find you on the web?

You bet! www.sportsleisure.com. There you'll find all our recent publications, valuable information on upcoming events and more. While there consider joining our online notification service, *By Invitation Only*, and we'll inform you of time-dated opportunities that present themselves between regular newsletter cycles.

I hear you refer to customers as "members." Do I have to join a club to travel with you?

Absolutely not, though most travelers do elect to join the *Sports Leisure Travel Club*. Only through club membership will you receive the annual catalog, our bimonthly newsletter *The Traveler* and invitations to our special events. Additionally, only members can participate in Travel Club Gold, our bonus rewards program. A complimentary membership is extended to new and potential travelers upon request. After that, it's only \$10 per person, per year.

Are there any fees for cancellation after I make my deposit?

Outside 60 days before departure all tour payments (including CP) are refunded less a \$20 per person administrative fee upon cancellation. Within the 60 days before departure, refund provisions vary from tour to tour. International tours, cruises and national park tours often have additional restrictions. Please refer to our Special Vacation Notes and Information brochure for more specific details.

I have dietary restrictions. Is this going to be a problem?

If you have mild dietary restrictions (vegetarian, lactose or gluten intolerant), it is important for you to advise us at the time of registration. As you can certainly understand, it is quite difficult for your Tour Director to accommodate those who wait until they are actually traveling to share their special needs. If you have severe or multiple dietary restrictions you may find this type of travel is not for you.

Can I make other special requests?

You are invited to make special requests of the airline and hotel(s) serving your vacation at the point of reservation. The more notice we have, the better our ability to accommodate you. Requests might include specific airline seating, an upgrade and the need for wheelchair assistance at airports; and at hotels a king bed or handicap-

accessible room. Handicap-accessible rooms are limited. We ask you to make this request only if your condition demands it. There could be another traveler who needs the room more than you.

Please note we automatically request a non-smoking room for everyone in the group and a room with two beds for those traveling double occupancy unless you tell us otherwise.

I live in Nevada. What does your company offer me?

We welcome our Nevada travelers with open arms! Most of you live in residential communities in Reno and Sparks. Our flyaway tours are priced to include air and door-to-door service for those living in the Sacramento, Reno/Sparks, and Carson City areas. Those living a distance from the airports in Sacramento or Reno should consult with our office to determine the options best for you, some of which may add to the advertised tour price. At present, motorcoach tours depart only from the Sacramento area.

Can you explain "door-to-door service"?

Quite simply this means we will pick you up and return you to your home on all vacations of three days or longer. This service may involve a sedan, SUV, limousine or other chauffeured vehicle.

Provided by Baylight Transportation Services in the Sacramento metropolitan area, door-to-door service is included within these boundaries: Davis on the west, Galt on the south, Auburn and Shingle Springs on the east, Woodland to the north. Service is available for an additional charge for travelers living in Stockton, Yuba City/ Marysville, Grass Valley, Winters, Vacaville, Fairfield, Placerville, Pollock Pines and Colfax

Nevada door-to-door service is provided by Bell Limousine to anyone living in the Reno/Sparks metropolitan area and south to Carson City.

An \$85 per person credit is available for travelers to whom this service isn't available or for those who wish to opt out and meet us at the point of departure.

Another option for those who live in outlying areas is to overnight in Sacramento. We have negotiated a special reduced rate of \$99 per night plus tax at the Best Western PLUS Sutter House located downtown at 1100 H Street. You can leave your car there while on vacation and enjoy door-to-door service between the hotel and airport. Call (916) 441-1314 or 1-800-830-1314 and ask for the special *Sports Leisure* rate. We are happy to make recommendations for our Nevada travelers in need of similar services.

On overnight and daytrips, motorcoaches depart from convenient neighborhood pick-up points throughout the greater Sacramento area. Door-to-door service is available for a fee on daytrips and overnighters. Call the office for details.

What can I expect from the motorcoaches you charter?

If you haven't been on a bus since school days, you'll find modern motorcoaches to be a vastly different experience. Whether locally or in fly-away destinations on our continent and beyond, we seek only the best equipment and drivers available with three things in mind: your pleasure, your comfort and above all your safety. Onboard amenities usually include plush seating, audio and video systems, wifi, electrical outlets, climate control and a restroom. Additionally, your Tour Director is never far away with a bottle of water and other refreshments. Of course, our exclusive galley-equipped coach is used on many daytrips and overnighters, as well as selected long-distance trips unless it is unavailable due to maintenance or highway size restrictions.

You have assigned seating on your tours. What's that about?

By the vote of our membership, we do not rotate motorcoach seats as many companies do. You are free to select the seating of your choice at the point of



reservation. Single travelers are sometimes required to take available single seats to leave remaining pairs for those traveling with a friend or spouse.

What about airport security restrictions? They seem to change all the time.

The Transportation Security Administration requires that you provide us your date of birth and full name as it appears on your government-issued photo identification for all vacations involving air travel. Complete passport information is additionally required in advance for international travel. Up-todate security information can be found on the internet at www.tsa.gov, including details on how you can qualify for TSA Pre-Check. Our staff stays current on the latest regulations in order to provide you timely and accurate assistance.

Have passport rules changed?

Passports are required for all travel outside the U.S. including Canada and Mexico. If you are of foreign citizenship, we highly recommend you check with your country's embassy and follow its instructions to make certain your travel will be legal and seamless. U.S. citizens in need of a passport can pick up an application at any post office or find it online. Please allow 8-10 weeks for processing. Your passport must be valid for at least six months past the scheduled ending date of your international tour.

Do I need to worry about airline baggage charges?

As each airline has different policies regarding luggage and associated charges, you may expect rules and restrictions (number of bags allowed, weight, etc.) to vary from trip to trip. You have this **Sports** Leisure promise: You will never pay to check your first bag on any flight on a U.S. airline. Should you wish to bring a second checked bag, please be prepared to pay your Tour Director at check-in. Second bag charges are not limited to airline fees and may include other handlers such as hotel bellmen. The Tour Planner can advise you of additional charges by calling the office in advance of your departure. You might also find the airline's website helpful.

Checked bag have a weight limit of 40 or 50 lbs. (depending on the trip). Bags weighing more will incur additional fees or be rejected. This policy applies throughout the tour. Many "wheelie" bags and oversized carry-ons that fit in airline overhead bins cannot be accommodated within the cabin of the motorcoach. In such cases, you will be asked to check them coachside with your Tour Director. They will be tagged and available coachside at each overnight stop.

Are my payments protected when I pay for my vacation in advance?

Your deposits and final payments are protected in accordance with the State of California Seller of Travel Law (#2011549-40). In addition, Sports Leisure Vacations is a proud member of the Northeast California Better Business Bureau with an A+ rating.

Can a friend from another city sign up for a Sports Leisure vacation, or join me for a meal or visit at one of our destinations?

Yes! We can arrange travel for friends or relatives to meet our groups from any city in the world. (We currently have over 1,000 Travel Club members who live outside the Sacramento area.) If you have friends or relatives who would like to travel with you, have them call us toll free at 1-800-951-5556. With advance notice, we are also happy to welcome your friends or relatives who may live along the tour route and wish to join us for a meal or attraction.

Can I extend my vacation to visit friends or relatives?

The answer is almost always yes, particularly if you register and make your request at least 60 days prior to departure. Many travelers take advantage of this opportunity to visit friends or relatives, or explore a destination in greater detail on their own. There could be additional charges for flight deviations, but generally they are small. Local airport transportation can be provided for an additional \$50 per person. Please note unique air schedules are not covered by Cancellation Protection on domestic trips.

I have some trouble walking long distances. Will I be able to participate and enjoy the trip?

In order to get full value from a travel experience, it is important to be in good mental and physical health. Walking and some step-climbing are necessary to participate in the normal activities on our vacations. While we can do almost everything for you on a Sports Leisure vacation, the Tour Director cannot provide sustained attention to individual clients. Please be advised that we visit many cultural sites on tour, not all of which meet A.D.A. requirements due to their historic status. Refer to the Activity Meter and/or call our office to consult with the tour planner.

Let us assure you that people with mobility restrictions are welcome on our vacations. Many of our travelers are over 70 (or even 80 or 90), something we keep in mind when planning our itineraries. In our office, the Tour Planner for each departure knows

the itinerary well and would be happy to consult with you personally should you have questions regarding the amount of walking, elevations, etc., on a particular trip. Additionally, each trip is identified with an activity level. Check out the Activity Meter for each tour to get a feel for how it matches your interests, energy and fitness levels.

What if I become ill and cannot travel? Do you offer cancellation protection or travel insurance?

One or both are available on every departure. Either must be purchased at the time you make your initial tour payment. We strongly recommend you consider this optional protection. Please refer to the Special Vacation Notes and Information brochure for details. This coverage may not be available to those who have cancelled more than two tours in a 12-month period or who make their reservation less than one month prior to the departure date.

What does travel in the time of **COVID-19 look like to you?**

On August 13, 2020, we adopted a set of Health and Safety Protocols, including an Assumption of Risk and Waiver of Liability Agreement, which must be accepted and signed by every traveler before every trip - no exceptions. You can review the document on our website. In this everchanging climate these protocols could require adjustment. If so travelers will be notified and the website will be updated.

How does your company deal with "chronic complainers?"

One or two can ruin a trip for all. Sports Leisure Vacations reserves the right not to accept or retain anyone whose lack of personal hygiene or poor general behavior, in the opinion of the Tour Director, impedes the operation of the tour and/or affects the rights of other travelers. A refund of unused tour services is the limit of our liability if a person is required to leave the tour for the reasons stated above. Said passenger(s) will be responsible for any additional costs to return to the city of origin.

We want to learn, discover and have fun together. Our groups are often complimented on their positive attitude by tourism professionals and other travelers who encounter us on the road. Life is too short for making yourself and others around you miserable due to small challenges that are bound to occur. Travel is by nature an inexact science. Problem travelers will kindly be asked to find another company with whom to travel.
