You and your friends are invited to join us on Saturday, September 20th for our annual **Tour Preview Day.** Over the years, attendance at this event has become more and more essential, because it is the day our catalog of tours for the following year is released. Because it's a weekend, downtown traffic should be light. Of course, you are welcome to register for the free shuttle (see next page).

The catalog is mailed to all members and posted online at Noon on Monday, September 22nd. Those who attend Preview Day get a small but important jump on the new offerings. History tells up many new tours and cruises fill within the first couple of days.

About Preview Day: Clayton and Mark generally spend a bit of time taking you behind the scenes and talking a little about *Sports Leisure* and the company's history. With the help of staff, they will go over some of the "nuts and bolts basics" that make us a little different (and we'd like to think a *little better* than many other travel companies).

Each Tour Planner/Director gets a few minutes to talk about the tours they put together.
