From the beginning, here at *Sports Travel* (1979 -80), *Sports Leisure Travel* (1981-99) and finally *Sports Leisure Vacations* (2000-21), it has always been about the people, the people who travel with us.

Many of you are second (or even third) generation travelers with our company. Your mom (or grandmother in at least two cases), aunt, neighbor or someone you knew when you were younger traveled with us. I know this because I hear your stories on a regular basis and never tire of them. Since we have been here for 43 years, it's not surprising. There is no better compliment than "word of mouth" advertising and that is the way most people hear of our offerings – through someone like you.

We are a small, local company. We have built our reputation on service and fairness. For over four decades we have tried to create travel adventures which are a "cut above." When it comes to refunds, changes and special requests, we pride ourselves on being fair and prompt. Even during 18 months of a pandemic, we strive to be the best. Your deposits with us are in escrow, as per California Seller of Travel rules, and those dollars only become ours after your travel is completed.

So that's how we got to this point, at least technically. But the real reason is our relationship with our travelers. It is the single thing we value the most.

There are lots of tour companies in the country. My best guess is 2,000-2,500 local players, with another 50 or so national/ international operators for you to choose from. But this upstart from Sacramento has become widely known as "unique." The way our trips operate, how our itineraries are developed and executed is a little bit different, and we'd like to think better, than the ways of some. You contribute to that with all of your feedback. The

evaluations, the little things you share with us while traveling, the articles and notes you send to our office, all play a role in where we go next and what we do when we get there.

I believe because of the way we operate *Sports Leisure Vacations*, we attract a slightly different type of traveler, and more importantly a different kind of **person**. "Nice people travel with *Sports Leisure*" isn't just a catchy line, it's the truth. Our tours tend to cost a little more. We aren't in the same league as luxury operators, but we also don't run "budget" tours.

Back to the people – truly that is the secret to success. In over 42 years we have issued in excess of **50,000 Travel Club**Memberships. Think of that: **50,000**. Enough to fill a large city. Wonderful people, many of them no longer with us. Oh, the memories that have been created. The friendships which have formed. From this corner comes the feeling that no matter what else, we have had a lot of fun together. We have laughed and shared and gotten stuck overnight together. ACTIVITY METER L M A E C

As part of our commitment to helping you select the right tour for your interests and physical abilities, check out the Activity Meter for each tour to get a feel for how it matches your interests, energy and fitness. It's important to note that more than one level may apply to a tour. For example, some will enjoy a visit to a national park by spending time in the visitor's center and taking a seat with a view. Others might prefer to hike on a nature trail. Same destination, same tour, two different levels of activity.

The letter abbreviations for each departure can be found in the Table of Contents listing for the tour. Where you see two letters, that indicates the ability to add activities or do optional things which increase the amount of physical activity (standing, walking, climbing stairs, etc.). The meter is a guideline. It is impossible to predict every situation on tour, since conditions may change before or during a trip which require itinerary adjustments.

Leisurely – A tour that can be enjoyed by all. A minimal amount of required walking on city streets or generally level surfaces, with few stairs. A theater day trip might be an example.

Moderate – A tour with some walking activities, and standing/strolling at attractions and museums and possibly some stair climbing. A daytrip to the ballpark or a short regional trip (Monterey, CA Coast) might be examples. A moderate trip could include air transportation and navigating through airports.

Active – A tour which includes longer walks (3-5 city blocks). Shorter walks could be on uneven surfaces. Days could be longer (including longer travel days with layovers). Some of the trips could be at high altitudes.

This would be the level for most of our longer distance domestic and Canadian tours, the minimum level for an overseas international tour. Tours which mention the ability to walk 3-5 city blocks **in a timely fashion** a couple of times a day fit into this category, as would most of our national park tours. You could find a flight of stairs without handrails. A tour with a seaplane or jeep ride, and the ability to climb into the plane/jeep, would be found in this category. Longer rail tours fit in this category.

Energetic – A tour with an accent on opportunities for walking and other physical activities. Many overseas tours would fit in this category. Long plane flights, perhaps standing or walking longer distances. You might have to climb into a boat, carriage or train. If you need wheelchair assistance at the airport or other places, you should not consider a tour on this level.

Challenging – Tours like these are designed with daily physical activities like hiking and other vigorous activities and can be great travel experiences, but they are not typical of Sports Leisure Vacations trips.

You'll partake in the Sunday buffet at the Wrigley Mansion, enjoy the view and the grub at Rustler's Roost, and learn a little at our Baseball Roundtable.

Our Baseball Banquet features a guest speaker with stories to bring a smile to any fan. A baseball old-timer, a player (or former player), manager or front office official joins

The parks are small, our seats generally in the shade (amazing how important that little detail is) and the atmosphere is casual and friendly. Our group will number 15-25.

Most teams put their tickets on sale November 1, so it is important to register before that date, so we can get you the

best possible seating. Those registering by November 1 are guaranteed space. Spring games (particularly the shaded seats we covet) often sell out quickly. Those calling after November 1 are on a space-available basis. Once the schedule is announced, we will forward the game schedule. Generally, we make the Giants our first choice, the A's our second. The schedule will include a total of five games.

Generally games are during the day, but increasingly teams are scheduling games under the lights. We won't know how many day/night games are on our itinerary until the schedule is finalized, but the weather is warm, so early evening games aren't an issue.

We have a convenient location between all eight parks, just north of the airport. No park is more than an hour from our headquarters. Enjoy a great buffet breakfast every morning (except Sunday, when we do brunch at the Wrigley Mansion) at the beautifully refurbished Marriott Hotel Phoenix Airport.

What does travel in the time of **COVID-19 look like to you?**

On August 13, 2020 we adopted a set of Health and Safety Protocols including an Assumption of Risk and Waiver of Liability Agreement which must be accepted and signed by every traveler before every trip. They are mailed with the Final Tour Notes shortly before each departure. In this everchanging climate the protocols have been updated many times and will continue to be as science and circumstance dictate. You can review these documents in their current versions at any time on our website. Like you we greatly anticipate the day when they will no longer be necessary!

Can I find you on the web?

You bet! www.sportsleisure.com. There you'll find all our recent publications, plus information on upcoming tours, events and more. While there consider joining our online notification service, By Invitation Only, and we'll inform you of time-dated opportunities that present themselves between regular newsletter cycles.



I hear you refer to customers as "members." Do I have to join a club to travel with you?

Absolutely not, though most travelers do elect to join the Sports Leisure Travel Club. Only through club membership will you receive the annual catalog, our bimonthly newsletter The Traveler and invitations to our special events. Additionally, only members can participate in Travel Club Gold, our bonus rewards program. A complimentary membership is extended to new and potential travelers upon request. After that, it's only \$10 per person, per year.

Are there any fees for cancellation after I make a payment?

Outside 60 days before departure (75 days on international vacations) all tour payments are refunded less a \$20 per person administrative fee upon cancellation, including CP. Within 60 days before departure refund provisions vary based on the tour and the reason for cancellation. Please refer to our Special Vacation Notes and Information brochure for details.

I have dietary restrictions. Is this going to be a problem?

If you have mild dietary restrictions (vegetarian, lactose or gluten intolerant), it is important for you to advise us at the time of registration. As you can certainly understand it is quite difficult for your Tour Director to accommodate those who wait until they are actually traveling to share their special needs. If you have severe or multiple dietary restrictions you may find this type of travel is not for you.



Can I make other special requests?

You are invited to make special requests of the airline and hotel(s) serving your vacation at the point of reservation. The more notice we have the better our ability to accommodate you. Requests might include specific airline seating, an upgrade or the need for wheelchair assistance at airports; and at hotels a king bed or handicapaccessible room. Handicap-accessible rooms are limited. We ask you to make this request only if your condition demands it. There could be another traveler who needs the room more than you.

Please note we automatically request a non-smoking room for everyone in the group and a room with two beds for those traveling double occupancy unless you tell us otherwise.

I live in Nevada. What does your company offer me?

We welcome our Nevada travelers with open arms! Most of you live in residential communities in Reno and Sparks. Our fly-away tours are priced to include air and door-to-door service for those living in the Sacramento, Reno/Sparks, and Carson City areas. Those living a distance from the airports in Sacramento or Reno should consult with our office to determine the options best for you, some of which may add to the advertised tour price. Motorcoach tours depart only from the Sacramento area.

Can you explain "door-to-door service"?

Quite simply this means we will pick you up and return you to your home on all vacations of three days or longer. This service may involve a sedan, SUV, limousine or other chauffeured vehicle.





Provided by Baylight Transportation Services in the Sacramento metropolitan area, door-to-door service is included within these boundaries: Davis on the west, Galt on the south, Auburn and Placerville on the east, Woodland to the north. Service is available for an additional charge for travelers living in Stockton, Yuba City/ Marysville, Grass Valley, Winters, Vacaville, Fairfield, Pollock Pines and Colfax. Nevada door-to-door service is provided by Bell Limousine to anyone living in the Reno/ Sparks metropolitan area and south to Carson City.

An \$85 per person credit is available for travelers to whom this service isn't available or for those who wish to opt out and meet us at the point of departure.

Another option for those who live in outlying areas is to overnight in Sacramento. We have negotiated a special reduced rate of \$99 per night plus tax at the Best Western PLUS Sutter House located downtown at 1100 H Street. You can leave your car there while on vacation and enjoy door-to-door service between the hotel and airport. Call (916) 441-1314 or 1-800-830-1314 and ask for the special Sports Leisure rate. We are

happy to make recommendations for our Nevada travelers in need of similar services.

On overnight and daytrips, motorcoaches depart from convenient neighborhood pickup points in the greater Sacramento area. Door-to-door service is available for a fee on daytrips and overnighters. Call the office for details.

What can I expect from the motorcoaches you charter?

If you haven't been on a bus since school days you'll find modern motorcoaches to be a vastly different experience. Whether locally or at fly-away destinations, we seek only the best equipment and drivers available with three things in mind: Your pleasure, your comfort and above all your safety. Onboard amenities usually include plush seating, audio and video systems, wifi, electrical outlets, climate control and a restroom. Additionally, your Tour Director is never far away with a bottle of water and other refreshments. Of course, our exclusive galley-equipped coach is used on many daytrips and overnighters in our region, as well as selected long-distance trips unless it is unavailable due to maintenance or highway size restrictions.

You have assigned seating on your tours. What's that about?

By the vote of our membership we do not rotate motorcoach seats as many companies do. You are free to select the seating of your choice at the point of reservation. Single travelers are sometimes required to take available single seats to leave remaining pairs for those traveling with a friend or spouse.

What about airport security restrictions? They seem to change all the time.

The Transportation Security Administration requires that you provide us your date of birth and full name as it appears on your government-issued photo identification for all vacations involving air travel. Complete passport information is additionally required in advance for international travel. Up-to-date security information can be found on the internet at www.tsa.gov, including details on how you can qualify for TSA Pre-Check. Our staff stays

current on the latest regulations in order to provide you timely and accurate assistance.

Have passport rules changed?

Passports are required for all travel outside the U.S. including Canada and Mexico. If you are of foreign citizenship, we highly recommend you check with your country's embassy and follow its instructions to make certain your travel will be legal and seamless. U.S. citizens in need of a passport can pick up an application at any post office or find it online. Please allow a minimum of three months for processing.

Your passport must be valid for at least six

months past the scheduled ending date of

Do I need to worry about airline baggage charges?

your international tour.

As each airline has different policies regarding luggage and associated charges, you may expect rules and restrictions (number of bags allowed, weight, etc.) to vary from trip to trip. You have this Sports Leisure promise: You will never pay to check your first bag on any flight on a U.S. airline. Should you wish to bring a second checked bag, please be prepared to pay your Tour Director at check-in. Second bag charges are not limited to airline fees and may include other handlers such as hotel bellmen. The Tour Planner can advise you of additional charges by calling the office in advance of your departure. You might also find the airline's website helpful.









Each checked bag has a strict weight limit of 40 or 50 pounds (depending on the trip). Bags weighing more will incur additional fees or be rejected. This policy applies throughout the tour. Many "wheelie" bags and oversized carry-ons that fit in airline overhead bins cannot be accommodated within the cabin of the motorcoach. In such cases, you will be asked to check them coachside with your Tour Director. They will be tagged and available coachside at each overnight stop.

Are my payments protected when I pay for my vacation in advance?

Your deposits and final payments are held in escrow until the tour returns in full accordance with the State of California Seller of Travel Law (#2011549-40).

Can a friend from another city sign up for a Sports Leisure vacation, or join me for a meal or visit at one of our destinations?

Yes! We can arrange travel for friends or relatives to meet our groups from any city in the world. (We currently have over 1,000 Travel Club members who live outside the Sacramento area.) If you have friends or relatives who would like to travel with you, have them call us toll free at 1-800-951-5556. With advance notice, we are also happy to welcome your friends or relatives who may live along the tour route and wish to join us for a meal or attraction.

Can I extend my vacation to visit friends or relatives?

The answer is almost always yes, particularly if you register and make your request at least 60 days prior to departure. Many travelers take advantage of this opportunity to visit friends or relatives, or explore a destination in greater detail on their own. There could be additional charges for flight deviations, but generally they are small. Local airport transportation can be provided for an additional \$50 per household. Please note unique air schedules are not covered by Cancellation Protection on domestic trips.

I have some trouble walking long distances. Will I be able to participate and enjoy the trip?

In order to get full value from a travel experience, it is important to be in good mental and physical health. Walking and some step-climbing are necessary to participate in the normal activities on our vacations. While we can do almost everything for you on a Sports Leisure vacation, the Tour Director cannot provide sustained attention to individual clients. Please be advised that we visit many cultural sites on tour, not all of which meet A.D.A. requirements due to their historic status.

Let us assure you that people with mobility restrictions are welcome on our vacations. Many of our travelers are over 70, 80 or even 90, something we keep in mind when planning our itineraries. In our office, the Tour Planner for each departure knows the itinerary well and would be happy to consult with you personally should you have questions regarding the amount of walking, elevations, etc., on a particular trip. Additionally, each trip is identified with an





activity level. Check out the Activity Meter for each tour to get a feel for how it matches your interests, energy and fitness levels.

What if I become ill and cannot travel? Do you offer cancellation protection or travel insurance?

One or both are available on every departure. Either must be purchased at the time you make your initial tour payment. We strongly recommend you consider this optional protection. Please refer to the Special Vacation Notes and Information brochure for details. This coverage may not be available to those who have cancelled more than two tours in a 12-month period or who make their reservation less than one month prior to the departure date.

How does your company deal with "chronic complainers?"

One or two can ruin a trip for all. Sports Leisure Vacations reserves the right not to accept or retain anyone whose lack of personal hygiene or poor general behavior, in the opinion of the Tour Director, impedes the operation of the tour and/or affects the rights of other travelers. A refund of unused tour services is the limit of our liability if a person is required to leave the tour for the reasons stated above. Said passenger(s) will be responsible for any additional costs to return to the city of origin.

We want to learn, discover and have fun together. Our groups are often complimented on their positive attitude by tourism professionals and other travelers who encounter us on the road. Life is too short for making yourself and others around you miserable due to small challenges that are bound to occur. Travel is by nature an inexact science. Problem travelers will kindly be asked to find another company with whom to travel.
