A career in the travel industry wasn't part of the plan. I traveled zero as a kid, mostly because growing up in a 3-child, single parent family meant travel fell down the list, behind things like groceries and bus fare for mom to get to and from work. Disneyland was but a glimmer in our eyes, a travel dream, if you would. Landing on the moon was more likely for the Hoffmann family.

Then life happened. Working at a local park district (Mission Oaks) as a young man gave me the opportunity to be the organizer for trips to baseball games and for the summer Marine World excursion for the kids. When I suddenly had more time, the baseball trips for adults began, informally, in 1977-78.

One day a bus driver commented that the concept of refreshments on the bus and a higher level of service might appeal to the seniors who traveled to Reno/Tahoe casinos on daytrips during the week. (Remember when you had to go to Nevada to gamble?) He was right. Our service started in 1979 and was an instant hit, much to the chagrin of competitors like Greyhound and Amador Stage Lines. Heavy government regulations restricting start-ups like us were about to go away, and Congressman Robert Matsui (who insisted you call him "Bob") stepped into the breach to help a small company that was being treated unfairly. A call from the congressman personally told us we were on our way, free of strangling restrictions, in late 1981.

The rest, as they say, is history. Soon the concept of reserved seating on the bus was hatched. We were the first to offer nonsmoking coaches and then the first to go completely non-smoking on all trips. Again, we were ahead of our time, that little company with the funny name. (We were originally Sports Travel, then Sports Leisure Travel, and finally **Sports Leisure Vacations**.) Out ahead in part because we encouraged feedback from our travelers and we listened. Clients started asking about "far away" destinations like Yosemite, Hearst Castle and the "Skunk Train" from Fort Bragg. Our first overnight tour was to Lake County and we stayed at the Konocti Harbor Inn. A wonderful old home haunted by ghosts at the top of Clear Lake, Robin Hill Food and Spirits, was our first memorable lunch stop.

By 1982, we had made our first trip to Hawaii. Australia and New Zealand followed the next year. Our mailing list grew, as your parents and yes, even your grandparents discovered our services. They told us how we could improve, but more importantly, they told their friends. It was becoming obvious we had something really special. We weren't like the other tour companies, and the people we interacted with on the road were always saying what nice people traveled with us. And they were right.

Travel is not an industry known for high salaries, unless you happen to be an airline pilot or climb to the top of the corporate ladder. For many of us, including myself and I suspect many on the **Sports Leisure** team, we are here because we enjoy what we do. We trade a bank account for a lower salary now, with the advantage of not having to wait until later in life to travel and learn and see and do.

Many of those who travel with *Sports Leisure*, and lifelong friends, look at us with envy. While sometimes our jobs are "never a dull moment" (the plane isn't flying, it's pouring rain, the traffic isn't moving...just to mention a few), they are often filled with wonder and discovery. I have met people on the road who have changed the way I've looked at the journey. Just before this catalog went to press, we completed tours of **Route 66** and **A Pilgrimage to Plains**. Both of them gave us a chance to look at a slice of our country, perhaps in a different light. We met the most fascinating people, made new friends, had our eyes opened, even pet a burro or two...

For most of my adult life, at least formally since the age of 24, I have been a Dream Weaver. I get to be part of a team that creates the dreams, takes our travelers to experience them, and then does the same thing all over again. So when the title of this year's catalog was first floated in a staff meeting, I smiled. Because at **Sports Leisure** we truly are **Dream Weavers**. We are blessed with the most amazing clients, many who become personal friends, to share the journey with. The **Sports Leisure** team is the most amazing group of people to work with. It would be difficult to paint a better picture if you were Rembrandt himself.

So humbly, I say thank you. Thank you for your business, for your referrals and for your friendship. Your support allows us to contribute to regional arts groups, to public television, to local charities, all of whom make our community better.

This is a journey we only get to make once. What an incredible blessing to have so many awesome people to share it with – travelers on their own journey who truly appreciate a great effort. We have shared many places together. The next adventure, big or small, is just around the corner...

# Flexibility is the Name of the Game

Throughout 2023 our earnest request to you, our travelers, has been to "remember the F-word: flexibility." More than a request, it's been our mantra. And good advice it is as the travel industry – **Sports Leisure** included – tries to find its way in a world so very different than the one we knew only a few years ago.

As you can see in the pages of our Dream Book, in 2024 – like the year before it – we're jetting, bussing, training and cruising all over the globe at levels that match or exceed 2019, but things are definitely different now. The world is not the same, so it stands to reason that the business of travel would not be the same. I don't think different is necessarily better or worse. It's just different.

A term I use often in reference to our industry is elasticity. In my mind this refers to the ability of a system to react to unexpected forces. For example, let's say a flight gets cancelled. Over how many future flights will it take the airline to move those travelers to their desired destination? And of equal if not greater importance, how many hours or days will it take to do it? For any given traveler the ramifications could be at least inconvenient and at most catastrophic. Let's say you were flying to Europe to catch a cruise ship. Arriving a day late could mean missing the boat. And in this case missing the boat quite possibly means missing part or all of your vacation!

Another example: You arrive at a hotel and discover someone neglected to enter part or all of the rooming list into their reservation system. Signed contracts and proof of prepayment count for very little if they don't have enough rooms to meet your needs. This actually happened to me twice this fall, and on the same trip! I did my job. Someone on their end didn't. But none of that mattered because both hotels lacked the number of rooms – the elasticity – required to accommodate the entire group. There was quite literally no room in the inns!

So what to do when you can't have the flight you needed; if the hotel gave your bed to someone else for the night? When you travel with *Sports Leisure Vacations* you are not alone! Your tour director is trained and has the resources to navigate the situation, supported by a full staff of professionals at the office as well as the invaluable assistance of our many friends in travel who live in the region and are familiar with the lay of the land and the suppliers who work there. Often they know of the situation even before the tour director and travelers do, and they're already working on solutions on our behalf. I'm happy to report that in the two cases mentioned above we did not sleep in the bus! We found alternate hotels that could accommodate our needs, and seemed happy to have the business. But it took time and patience. And above all, flexibility!

Sometimes people ask me why we do things the way we do: Why fly to the port a day or a few days before the cruise departs? Why allow so much time for airport connections? Why plan so much driving time between points A and B? (And especially, "Why leave Sacramento so many hours before the curtain?" I get that one all the time!) Why build in free time when the cost of travel is already so high? In many cases the answer is elasticity. If the industry won't give us the wiggle room we feel we may need, we have to do it for ourselves in all situations where it is feasible. There is little we can do to combat flight cancellations and hotel error, but we can certainly put in the time necessary to make sure we don't miss the boat, plane, train, reservation or curtain due to unforeseen circumstances like traffic, road construction, inadequate staffing or the like.

Admittedly all this may sound a bit discouraging, but the alternative is simply staying home. I don't think you'd be reading this if that was your intent. So just know this: The leadership and staff of **Sports Leisure Vacations** bring well over 300 years of travel experience to the table. On occasion we may not have any control over what's happening, but chances are we've been there before and have more than a few ideas about righting the situation. With your commitment to flexibility, we'll make it, and have a memorable time doing it.

We are extremely proud of our 2024 lineup of vacations, and hope you'll find them dream-worthy as well. We're offering a cruise through the Mekong Delta of Vietnam and Cambodia, and a tour focusing on the history and wine culture of the Czech Republic, and a three-week tour of the land down under, Australia – all **Sports** *Leisure* firsts. # What are your old coins worth?

Millions of years ago, before he started **Sports Leisure**, Mark was a coin collector and even had a booth at the Roseville Auction Yard in his late teens. Now he's taken up collecting (and occasionally selling) coins and currency once again as a hobby. Here's where you come in.



Maybe you have a bag or a box of old coins. Perhaps you inherited a collection when a relative passed. Maybe it's just one or two coins or bills of currency you'd like to know about. If your coins are pre-1964 (50c, 25c, 10c) or pre-1940

(pennies and nickels), or recent coins that are part of mintissued sets, they may have a premium value. Currency 1935 and before also fits into the "value" category.

But who/where can you take them to get an honest evaluation of their worth? Mark would be happy to give you a free appraisal. If you wish to sell your treasures, that is easy to arrange. Often Mark will offer to purchase them, or get you easily to someone who is interested. You can bring your coins to the office, or for larger heavier collections, Mark can come to you. Just call the office to set up an appointment. Feel free to share this offer with family and friends.

# ACTIVITY METER

As part of our commitment to help you select the perfect vacation, refer to the Activity Meter rating to better understand how it matches your interests, energy and fitness level – 1 is the most leisurely while 5 represents what for many could be an overly-challenging adventure. It's important to note that more than one rating may apply to a tour. For example, some travelers will enjoy a visit to a national park by spending time in the visitors center and taking a seat with a view, whilst others prefer to hike a nature trail. Same destination and tour, but two different levels of activity.

The ratings can be found in the Table of Contents and on the itinerary page for each tour. Two numbers indicate the ability to do optional things which limit or increase the amount of physical activity required. This meter is only a guideline. With specific questions or requirements, call the office and speak to the tour planner.

Each level requires your ability to board and disembark a motorcoach without assistance.

Leisurely – A tour that can be enjoyed by all requiring a minimal amount of walking on city streets and generally level surfaces. There could be a few stairs. A theater daytrip is an example.

**2** Moderate – A tour with some walking activities, standing/ strolling at attractions and museums, and some stair climbing. A daytrip to the ballpark or a museum exhibition, and short regional trips are examples. A moderate trip could include air or rail transportation and navigating through airports/stations.

**3** Active – A tour which includes longer walks and/or walks on uneven surfaces. Days could be longer including air travel days with layovers. Some of your time could be spent at destinations with high altitudes. This is the level for most of our long-distance domestic and Canadian tours, vacations featuring national parks, and the minimum level for an overseas international trip. You should be able to walk 3-6 city blocks in a timely fashion a few times per day. You could find a flight of stairs without handrails, uneven nature trails and the like. Tours with a seaplane or jeep ride, and the ability to climb into the plane/jeep, along with longer rail journeys fall into this category.

**4** Energetic – A tour with an emphasis on walking and other physical activities. Most overseas tours fit in this category, as well as many metropolitan domestic tours (New York and Washington, DC, especially). Expect long plane flights and walking longer distances at connections and/or customs. You might have to climb into a boat, carriage or train. You should not consider a tour on this level if you need wheelchair assistance at the airport or other places.

<sup>5</sup> Challenging – Tours like these are designed with daily physical activities like hiking and other vigorous pursuits. They can be great travel experiences, but are not typical of most *Sports Leisure Vacations* trips.

**5.** The morning is free to enjoy the shops at Coconut Plantation, adjacent to your hotel.

After lunch we head to Waimea Canyon, known as the Grand Canyon of the Pacific. On the return trip, an early dinner in Waimea at the Wrangler Steakhouse. Perhaps you'll want to pick up one of the red dirt shirts as a souvenir for yourself or a friend back home? **(FB,D)**

# **Historic Fort Bragg, Training By The Ocean**

Ride the old Skunk Train, enjoy North Coast Hospitality **3 Days • July 9-11**

Fort Bragg used to hold a spot on our calendar every year, sometimes twice. We would drive up, see The Footlighters (an old-time locally produced melodrama), visit the gardens and ride the train back to Willits. Alas, ten years ago a tunnel on the train route gave way, dumping thousands of tons of rock onto the track. Restoring the full route has and will continue to cost a tremendous amount of dollars, so the train today runs a short 3-mile route along Pudding Creek. The Footlighters have gone to melodrama heaven, but there are still plenty of reasons to visit the North Coast. There is so much history in the area, and because of its remote location, not everyone makes it up this way. Native Americans lived here (and still do), and the Union Lumber Company practically was the town for decades.

**1.** From Sacramento we make our way up I-5 to Williams, then west on Route 20 into Lake County where we'll stop for lunch at the Blue Wing Saloon, part of the historic Tallman Hotel. Travel on through Willits, arriving in Fort Bragg in the mid-afternoon. Your accommodations for two nights are at the Harbor Lite Lodge, overlooking Noyo Harbor below. Before dinner, a short walking/driving tour is offered. The city of Fort Bragg, yes, the whole city, is a California Historic Landmark. Learn of its logging history when the Skunk Trains were introduced and see the only two power poles made of redwood remaining from the old mill days (there's a cool story there!). The beautiful First Baptist Church also represents a great piece of local history and is a magnificent photo stop. Dinner is served at a popular local restaurant with options including locally-caught seafood. (L,D)

**2.** After breakfast, our first stop on a busy Fort Bragg day is at the Mendocino Coast Botanical Gardens. A docent leads us on a guided walk through the gardens, telling us the story of the couple who founded the site in 1961. Break for lunch at your leisure downtown, then board the famous Skunk Train for the short ride to Pudding Creek in early afternoon. Then we'll teach you a little about how table tops and the like are made from redwood burls. Back at your hotel, enjoy the view and a little down time. Dinner is included again this evening. **(B,D)**  **3.** Before the ride back to the valley, let's take a few minutes and walk the .6 mile accessible boardwalk loop trail at MacKerricher State Park. The park was at one time part of the Mendocino Indian Reservation as well as a part of the Union Lumber Company. It is located three miles north of Fort Bragg on Highway 1, near the town of Cleone. Our lunch stop is in Willits with the return to Sacramento slated for 4-5 pm. Our fleet of cars will be waiting at the *Sports Leisure* office to return you to your home. **(B,L)**

# What does travel in the time of COVID-19 look like to you?

COVID is still with us, and at the time of this publication infections are on the rise again. **A new booster vaccine is available and we strongly urge you to consider getting it** Vaccinated travelers have a lower

We reserve the right to reinstate a vaccination requirement and anything else we feel is essential for the heath and well being of our travelers, staff and suppliers. If our policies change we will make every effort to notify you through printed and electronic publications and announcements, on our website and in the Final Tour Notes mailed out shortly before each extended tour departure.

#### Can I find you on the web?

You bet! At **www.sportsleisure.com** you'll find all our recent publications, plus information on upcoming tours, events and more.

#### I hear you refer to customers as "members." Do I have to join a club to travel with you?

Absolutely not, though most travelers do elect to join the **Sports Leisure Travel Club**. Only through club membership will you receive the annual catalog, our bimonthly newsletter *The Traveler* and invitations to our special events. Additionally, only members can participate in Travel Club Gold and Day Tripper rebates, our bonus rewards programs. A complimentary membership is extended to new and potential travelers upon request. After that, it's only \$10 per person, per year.





# Are there any fees for cancellation after I make a payment?

Outside 70 days before departure (sometimes longer on international vacations) all tour payments are refunded less a \$20 per person administrative fee upon cancellation. Within 70 days before departure refund provisions vary based on the tour and the reason for cancellation. Please refer to our *Special Vacation Notes and Information* brochure for details.

# I have dietary restrictions. Is this going to be a problem?

If you have mild dietary restrictions (vegetarian, lactose and/or gluten intolerant), it is important for you to advise us at the time of registration. As you can certainly understand it is quite difficult for your Tour Director to accommodate those who wait until they are actually traveling to share their special needs. **If you have severe or multiple dietary restrictions you may find this type of travel is not for you.** 

# Can I make other special requests?

You are invited to make special requests of the airline and hotel(s) serving your vacation at the point of reservation. The more notice we have the better our ability to accommodate you. Requests might include specific airline seating, an upgrade or the need for wheelchair assistance at airports; and at hotels a king bed or handicapaccessible room. Handicap-accessible rooms are limited. We ask you to make this request only if your condition demands it. There could be another traveler who needs the room more than you. **Some special requests, like airline seating, may only be available at additional cost.** 

Please note we automatically request a non-smoking room for everyone in the group and a room with two beds for those traveling double occupancy unless we are told otherwise.

#### Can you explain "door-to-door service"?

Quite simply this means we will pick you up and return you to your home on all vacations of three days or longer. This service may involve a sedan, SUV, limousine or other chauffeured vehicle.

Provided by Baylight Transportation Services in the Sacramento metropolitan area, door-to-door service is included within these boundaries: Davis on the west, Elk Grove on the south, Auburn (95603) and Shingle Springs on the east, Woodland to the north. Service is available for an additional charge for travelers living in Galt, Stockton, Yuba City/Marysville, Grass Valley, Winters, Vacaville, Fairfield, Placerville, Lake of the Pines/Auburn (95602) and Colfax.

A \$100 per person credit is available for travelers to whom this service isn't available or for those who wish to opt out and meet us at the point of departure (usually the airport, train station or office). Another option for those who live in outlying areas is to overnight at a hotel located near the departure point.

On *Daycations* and overnighters motorcoaches depart from convenient neighborhood pick-up points in the greater Sacramento area. Door-to-door service is available for a fee on day and overnight trips. Call the office for details.

#### What can I expect from the motorcoaches you charter?

Whether locally or at fly-away destinations, we seek only the best equipment and drivers available with three things in mind: Your pleasure, your comfort and above all your safety. Onboard amenities usually include plush seating, audio and video systems, wifi, electrical outlets, climate control and a restroom. Additionally, your Tour Director is never far away with water and other refreshments.

# You have assigned seating on your tours. What's that about?

We do not rotate motorcoach seats as many companies do. You are free to select the seating of your choice at the point of reservation. Single travelers are sometimes required to take available single seats to leave remaining pairs for those traveling with a friend or spouse. It's important to note many of our extended tours have limited capacity, allowing you to spread out in the rear of the coach if desired.

# What about airport security restrictions?

They seem to change all the time. The Transportation Security Administration requires that you provide us your date of birth and full name as it appears on your government-issued photo identification for





all vacations involving air travel. Complete passport information is additionally required in advance for international travel. Up-todate security information can be found on the internet at www.tsa.gov, including details on how you can qualify for TSA Pre-Check. Our staff stays current on the latest regulations in order to provide you timely and accurate assistance.

#### Have passport rules changed?

Passports are required for all travel outside the U.S. including Canada and Mexico. If you are of foreign citizenship, we highly recommend you check with your country's embassy and follow its instructions to make certain your travel will be legal and seamless. U.S. citizens in need of a passport can pick up an application at any post office or find it online. **Please allow a minimum of three months for processing. Your passport must be valid for at least six months past the scheduled ending date of your international tour.** 

# Do I need to worry about airline baggage charges?

As each airline has different policies regarding luggage and associated charges, you may expect rules and restrictions (number of bags allowed, weight, etc.) to vary from trip to trip. You have this **Sports**  *Leisure* promise: You will never pay to check your first bag on any flight on a U.S. airline.

Each checked bag has a strict weight limit of 40 or 50 pounds (we ask that you limit to 40#, airlines are at 50#). Bags weighing more will incur additional fees or be rejected. This policy applies throughout the tour. Many "wheelie" bags and oversized carry-ons that fit in airline overhead bins cannot be accommodated within the cabin of the motorcoach. In such cases you will be asked to check them coachside with your Tour Director. They will be tagged and available coachside at each overnight stop.

# Are my payments protected when I pay for my vacation in advance?

Your deposits and final payments are held in escrow until the tour returns in full accordance with the State of California Seller of Travel Law (#2011549-40).

#### Can a friend from another city sign up for a *Sports Leisure* vacation, or join me for a meal or activity at one of our destinations?

Yes! We can arrange travel for friends or relatives to meet our groups from any city in the world. (We currently have over 1,000 Travel Club members who live outside the





Sacramento area.) If you have someone who would like to travel with you, have them call us toll free at 1-800-951-5556. With advance notice, we are also happy to welcome your friends or relatives who may live along the tour route and wish to join us for a meal or attraction.

# **Can I extend my vacation to visit friends or relatives?**

The answer is almost always yes, particularly if you register and make your request at least 70 days prior to departure. Many travelers take advantage of this opportunity to visit friends or relatives, or explore a destination in greater detail on their own. There could be additional charges for flight deviations, but generally they are small. Local airport transportation can be provided for an additional \$50 per household. Please note unique air schedules are not covered by Cancellation Protection on domestic trips.

#### I have some trouble walking long distances. Will I be able to participate and enjoy the trip?

Walking and some step-climbing are necessary to participate in the normal activities on our vacations. While we can do almost everything for you on a *Sports Leisure* vacation, the Tour Director cannot provide sustained attention to individual clients. Please be advised that we visit

many cultural sites on tour, not all of which meet A.D.A. requirements due to their historic status and/or physical layout. Let us assure you that people with mobility restrictions are welcome on our vacations. Many of our travelers are over 70, 80 or even 90, something we keep in mind when planning our itineraries. The Tour Planner for each departure knows the itinerary well and would be happy to consult with you personally should you have questions regarding the amount of walking, elevations, etc., on a particular trip. Additionally, each trip is rated with an activity level to identify energy and fitness levels.

#### What if I become ill and cannot travel? Do you offer cancellation protection or travel insurance?

One or both are available on every departure. Either must be purchased at the time you make your initial tour payment. We strongly recommend you consider this optional protection. Please refer to the *Special Vacation Notes and Information* brochure for details. This coverage may not be available to those who have cancelled more than two tours in a 12-month period or who make their reservation less than one month prior to the departure date.

#### How does your company deal with "chronic complainers?"

One or two can ruin a trip for all. **Sports Leisure Vacations** reserves the right not to accept or retain anyone whose lack of personal hygiene or poor general behavior, in the opinion of the Tour Director, impedes the operation of the tour and/or affects the rights of other travelers. A refund of unused tour services is the limit of our liability if a person is required to leave the tour for the reasons stated above. Said passenger(s) will be responsible for any additional costs to return to the city of origin.

We want to learn, discover and have fun together. Our groups are often complimented on their positive attitude by tourism professionals and others who encounter us on the road. Life is too short for making yourself and those around you miserable due to small challenges that are bound to occur. Travel is by nature an inexact science.
