Greetings from the Grand Strand - Myrtle Beach, South Carolina!

In the past three weeks I've led tours through Louisiana, Virginia and

Carolinas. Over the next couple of months I'll be in Georgia, Florida, Texas, Missouri, Illinois and pav Virginia a return visit. This spring seems almost normal...



Normal. Have we

ever used that word more than over the past two years? So many ask me when things are going to get back to normal? Now that's the million dollar question. With all due respect, if I could answer that I wouldn't be working for a tour company in Sacramento! No - I'd be bigger than the president. I'd be the king of the world!

All kidding aside, what I can tell you is what I've seen and experienced both as a tour planner and director over these past few months. All my spring tours have been operated before, some of them annually, so I have personal knowledge of both prepandemic and post-pandemic "normal." Some things are just about the same, and wonderfully so. In New Orleans I had turtle soup at Court of Two Sisters, hot beignets at Café du Monde and Bananas Foster at Brennan's. Best of all I got to work with "my brother from another mother" Willie Gibson. He's been driving for us for years. It was great catching up; trading battle stories of life and loves, wins and losses, storms and survival since we were last together in 2019. But we made it! We're still here!

One of Sports Leisure's most successful itineraries ever is the Colorful Carolina Coast. To the best of my memory I first ran the trip in 1995, and we've offered it nearly every year since. There have been occasional changes when a new hotel, restaurant or attraction entered the market. but by and large it has remained the same over the years. I could lead this tour with my eyes closed and hands tied behind my back, and historically the planning process has been just as simple. Well not this year! Only one restaurant – ONE! – from the 2019 itinerary is on this year's tour. Why all the rejections? Staffing issues were the most common excuse. One restaurant increased the per person minimum spend from \$30 p.p. to \$75; another to \$120 p.p. Regardless of the budget, we quite simply can't eat that much! One restaurant was quite literally "gone with the wind." It was blown away by Hurricane Dorian!

Feeding a group at a reasonable time ("we only take groups for lunch at 10:30 or 3." Who eats lunch then???) and price is one of our biggest challenges presently. We want to give you a memorable meal; something that's fresh and local. We want to avoid chains. And we almost never do a boxed meal. Well, never say never! Back in the day our hotel was always a fall-back food option, especially when it came to

breakfast, but that's also changing. With only a few days notice I was informed by one of the hotels on CCC that they were no longer serving breakfast. Hello muffins, yoghurt and bananas served on the coach! (And no, the room rate was not discounted when the continental breakfast went away.) Another hotel, a "full-service" one at that, decided not to reopen their restaurant this season - one I was counting for a couple of no-host meals. They told me the bar offered "grab and go" items.

I hope this doesn't sound overly negative. That's not my point at all. I'm just trying to give you a glimpse into our world. Sports Leisure Vacations is not a fly-by-night company, nor a budget one. We pride ourselves on quality and service. But our ability to provide you the very best depends upon our contracts, agreements and often personal relationships with suppliers. When they let us down, we let you down. When they cease to exist, we're left out in the cold. When they make significant operational changes, we're eating muffins on the coach. Suppliers aren't bad people. They're just doing their best to survive in what remain extremely challenging times for our industry, country and world. Just like us. Maybe this describes you, too.

At church I learned "and it came to pass" is the most-used phrase in the Bible. Nothing comes to stay – everything comes to pass. These challenging times will pass, and maybe - just maybe - the new normal will be better than ever. Until then thank you for sticking with us. Thanks for your understanding and patience; your love and support. It is a pleasure and honor to help make your travel dreams come true!

The Barber Pole, or Once Over Lightly

Information of Importance to Sports Leisure Travelers

Our gang gathered together twice in the same week recently, for **in person** staff meetings. Those were held every Tuesday at noon for years, but with COVID and office closures and people working from home, staff meetings became difficult. Once in a while on Zoom, but something was lost on those calls/meetings. In person meetings are far better.

When the staff came together, we asked them, "What would you like us to put on **The Barber Pole** page? What do we need to remind our travelers about? (This was also important for Mark, since he's been out of the office for a month after surgery.) What would make your job go smoother?" We invite you to read on and get important updates on a variety of **SLV** travel topics. — **Mark & Clayton**

Have a walker, scooter or other assistive device you are bringing on tour?

The only way we can guarantee space for your walker/scooter/etc. on trips with home pick-up is if you notify us in advance. That way, we can dispatch the proper vehicle. Please make sure you share this information no later than 3 weeks prior to departure. Why three weeks? The car dispatch has to be prepared for everyone's pick up, and work on those schedules begins three weeks before the trip.

I Think I'd Like to Fly First Class...

Our tour prices include standard coach seating. When we aren't utilizing Southwest, there are a couple of ways to upgrade your ticket.

First, and most obvious, **upgrade to First Class**. If you are purchasing these seats, they generally cost about 2 ½ times the price of a coach ticket. Many of you have "mileage banks" that you have accumulated over the years. You can often use those miles to upgrade. Mileage upgrades are based on availability, so get your request in soon.

A second way to get a little more space on the plane is by purchasing **Economy Plus**. These seats are located behind first class. They offer extra leg room and generally cost \$40-\$100 per flight segment.

Really important: Make your upgrade request early. Cash customers are in, mileage travelers sometimes wait a day for confirmation or rejection or are put on our

upgrade waitlist.. Remember, **make your** request early.

Be a Good Customer/Traveler

From time to time on this page, we talk about the importance of getting your tour payments in on time; ditto for meal choices when we send them to you. Most often, we find ourselves waiting for one or two people to fall in line. Talking among ourselves as a staff, we found that often it's the same people who cause extra work and complications. We don't want to charge people for late payments or reminder phone calls, because generally, that doesn't change behavior.

So starting April 1, we are going to do something a little different. If you are on the list on chronic "non-responders," and your name pops up on the "didn't pay/didn't respond" list for a tour, you will get one reminder call. One time. From Mark Hoffmann, the owner. After that call, you will only be a welcome traveler if you pay in full at the time of registration and provide us three ways to reach you.

Our apology if this sounds negative. We faithfully make payments for your trip in advance, often months before your final payment is due. We also know lots of people don't read articles like this in the newsletter.

Mask and Vaccine Card Update

We are now going mask less at most venues. At this time, you **must be vaccinated and boosted to travel with Sports Leisure.** Because we know you have met that requirement before boarding the coach, we are comfortable not wearing masks on board. However, until at least April 18th, you must wear a mask on any sort of public transportation, including train depots, airline and bus terminals.

In addition, some of the places we visit are still requiring masks to be worn. **For this reason, you MUST travel with your own mask.** Sometimes you can get one at the venue, but often they don't have extras. On one trip, we had a number of people who didn't have masks with them. Others shared extras, but we barely covered everyone.

For emphasis, one more time – Bring a mask with you when you travel, or risk not being admitted to some places. Ditto for vaccination cards. You must show one, or a suitable copy, to board the coach. Recently, a traveler went with us to Modesto, but couldn't get into the theater....no vaccination card.

You also need your ID. Because some people have taken to using others vaccination cards, many venues requiring vaccination are also asking for the ID, so they can see it matches the name on the card. (This is more about the general public than it is SLV, but we have to play by the rules.)


