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Just One Man's Opinion

COVID has brought a lot of challenges to travelers and those who take them places.

We couldn't travel to many places (still can't go to some), and even if we can we have to mask up, take our shots, bring our papers, take our tests, wait for results... Being a traveler takes



patience and time and some real effort. Armchair travelers are staying at home. And to be fair, so are a group of folks, some of them **SLV members**, who have medical situations which would put them at much higher risk.

You, as travelers, we as the people to take you there, have held up relatively well. We have waited, jumped in when there was an

opening (the virus let up), pulled back when there was not. Now, it appears one more jolt is upon us.

Because in part no one could travel the way they wanted to for two years (and counting), there is a lot of pent up demand. Lots of people are chomping at the bit to go someplace, and then someplace different, and then....you get the idea. In economics, when there is too much demand chasing too little supply, prices go up. Demand is exceeding supply. So the sellers (hotels, airlines, etc.) can raise prices.

That is exactly what is happening, particularly in the hotel world. \$100 a night increases are not uncommon, sometimes \$150. It's mind boggling.

Scott Angeletti, for many years, has put together and escorted a trip to the California Coast, to stay at a lovely little property with a spectacular view of the ocean. When Scott called to set up the trip for this year, he was offered a rate \$100 more than the previous year. "There must be a mistake," Scott thought. But there was no mistake. Indeed, the hotel was asking \$100 more a night. Surprised and shocked, Scott decided to pass and not offer the always-sold out tour this year, because the hotel increase alone would drive the price up \$225 per person, \$450 for single travelers.

Restaurant prices are up, because we have finally decided to pay living wages to people who used to make \$10-\$12 an hour. But that fairness has come at a cost on the menu, while at the same time restaurants are being pressured by higher food prices in the kitchen.

Even airfares are up, although not quite as much, on a percentage basis, as hotels and

restaurants. Motorcoach prices are jumping, too, because of much higher fuel costs.

In many cases, short-term, we have absorbed these costs. Fuel surcharges for buses, price increases for menus where the menu wasn't agreed to at the time the space was reserved, those are examples of situations this fall and winter where we have paid the increase out of pocket, rather than ask our travelers for last minute surcharges. As new tours are announced, these increases can be built in.

As I create pricing for new tours, I am floored by some of the increases. **New York City**, where we love to stay at the Marriott in Times Square, is getting \$80 a night more for rooms than they did in the spring of 2019. With a 5 night stay, it means about \$250 a person (double) more for the trip.

Those who signed up for their 2022 trips early saved some big dollars. (There are still a few scattered spaces left on previously announced 2022 tours, you can see them in the Tour Calendar in this newsletter). New travel is going to cost more, for now. Not just **Sports Leisure** travel, but travel of all types. It's very possible this supply/demand thing will correct itself in the next 6-12 months and prices will slip back or at least stabilize.

Information of Importance to Sports Leisure Travelers

Updated Business Hours

Seems like our hours change all the time. It's a combination of trying to meet the call demand without having people sitting around with nothing to do and everyone still making enough money to pay the rent. Whew. That was a mouthful. But that one sentence sums up a bit of the challenge for most businesses right now.

Sports Leisure Vacations is open M-F, 9am – 3:30pm. We will be closed on Monday, February 21st, Presidents Day. You may leave a message before or after business hours. I know some people will be disappointed "Alistair" is no longer greeting callers on the phone...ok, perhaps some will not. Our lobby is open to visitors. We ask that you wear a mask.

COVID Protocols as of January 20, 2022

The definition of fully vaccinated now means you have had the regular vaccine shot(s) **and the booster shot.** You should have these at least 14 days before you begin travel.

We have also gone back to hand sanitizing when boarding the coach and wearing masks while on board. It's not what we would all prefer, but it helps keep us safe. It's worth pointing out there have not been any reports of virus outbreaks within **SLV** groups. We have had two travelers report illness roughly two weeks after returning home. We notified other travelers in those groups. Our protocols seem to be working (along with a little luck, let's be honest).

If you have any questions regarding our COVID protocols, please contact us at the office **prior to your trip.** We are not in a position to discuss these protocols at

the bus or airport on the day of departure. Those conversations and the questions and concerns that may be connected with them, need to be addressed in advance.

Walkers – Need Advance Notice

This is a really small but important item for a few people. **If you are traveling with a walker, a scooter or other assistive walking device larger than a cane, you MUST NOTIFY US IN ADVANCE.** Cars are routed based on their size, the number of people being picked up, and anticipated luggage. If you are adding a large item like a walker, you must call and tell us in advance. If you do not, we cannot guarantee the vehicle which picks you up will have room for your device. **REALLY IMPORTANT!!!!**

For right now, we are back to wearing masks on the bus. Our travelers and staff are more than willing to take whatever measures are needed to be just a bit safer.

Most of our Christmas season tours operated without issue. COVID claimed our


trip to New York to see the Westminster Dog Show in January, and there have been a few other cancellations. For those who are still a little skittish, I strongly recommend you keep an eye on your calendar.

Sports Leisure Vacations has a

cancellation policy with a little different twist than most other companies, and it can work in your favor if you are not 100% ready to travel. But it requires you to think ahead. Up until 60 days prior to departure, you can cancel any US tour without penalty (75 days for Canada).

Why this policy and those restrictions? Because that's generally when we have to start paying for performance and airline tickets, plus make non-refundable deposits and commitments to other components of the tour. If you cancel before we make those commitments, little is lost. **(Please note that once or twice a year there are tours where the cancellation penalty kicks in more than 60 days out...** generally because theater tickets have to be purchased on your behalf.)

I have many bits and pieces to share with you in this wonderful New Year! So without further ado let's jump right in . . .

Travel Club and Gold Club Membership Updates:

Sports Leisure Vacations

is a membership organization. You don't have to be a member to travel



with us, but you do have to be an active (dues-paying) member to receive our annual catalogue and newsletters by mail and to participate in our various Member Reward Programs. For example, only members receive a discount on every tour they take.

One of our most popular Member Rewards is the **Day Tripper Card**. Travel on six *Daycations* and receive a \$10 bill – it's as simple as that!

Travel Club Gold is certainly our most valuable program, designed to identify and reward our most frequent travelers. A member reaches Gold Club status by traveling 20 days in any combination – 2 ten-day tours, 4 five-day tours, 20 *Daycations* – just do the math. After becoming Gold a member receives double member discounts, and accrues and can redeem Gold Passport Points for life!

The top level of Gold Club membership is called **Current Gold**, earned when a member remains active by traveling at least 8 days per year. Their reward is receiving every edition of *The Traveler* by first class mail, giving them a head start over the thousands who receive theirs by slower bulk mail.

Our database cannot keep up with all these counts! Therefore the burden of responsibility rests on our members for many of these programs. Travelers should always arrive for a departure with their Travel Club Membership, Day Tripper and (if still working towards the 20 days) Travel Club Gold Registration cards in hand. Once

Gold/Current Gold, our database manages your Gold Passport Points account. Multiple cards? Staple them together. It's not necessary that all signatures be on the same card. Think you are missing credits? Road staff cannot help you with this as we lack access to the database. Best to make an appointment to come into the office and sort it out.

In early 2020 we froze each member's membership level and status. No one expired. No one was demoted from Current Gold to Gold due to their inability to travel. We continued this through 2021 as well. Now, effective with the start of a new year and with the vast majority of our vacations scheduled to operate as planned, we are returning to our former system. Those with memberships expiring in 2022 will receive renewal notices. Only those Gold Club members traveling a minimum of 8 days this year will retain Current Gold status in 2023.

I realize this is a lot of information! Call me if anything isn't clear as mud.

Catching Zzzzz at Sacramento International Airport

For many years our travelers who live outside the greater Sacramento area have enjoyed a deal at the downtown Best Western where they could spend the night for a reduced rate and leave their car for free for the duration of the tour. That property ceased to be a hotel late last year. First I did some research to see how many people actually do this annually. The answer was surprisingly small – less than a dozen in 2018 and 2019 combined! Without volume, it's quite difficult to convince anyone to give us a deal. A Google search on "hotels near Sacramento airport" produces 134 hits! Their prices are all over the place. A couple things to look for beyond the overnight rate: Do they operate a shuttle? And how much do they charge for long-term parking? I've been checking rates and offers frequently over the past few months. The average room rate is around \$150 plus a parking fee around \$70/week regardless of how many days your car is actually there. Many offer a

"park and fly" rate which bundles the room and parking charges at a small savings. At the end of the day there's no one hotel I can recommend. Just go online and select the deal and/or the brand that seems best. You might elect to save the hotel parking fee and our door-to-door transportation fee by simply driving yourself to the airport and parking there. Or use their parking and shuttle to save our door-to-door fee. Be sure to let us know of your decision as far in advance as possible. Thanks!

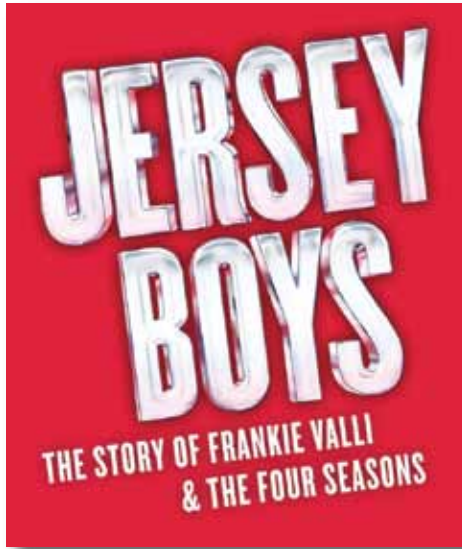
