At Tour Preview Day back in August we polled each person present to give us their dream destination. By far the majority of you named places off the North American continent. Mark published the list in order on page 5 of the November/December edition of The Traveler... then I got to work! The task was made easier because the National Tour Association met in November, giving Mark and me the opportunity to reconnect with many of our international tourism partners who can help us turn your dreams into realities in the coming months!

We are working on a land tour (not a cruise) to Australia for 2024. Portugal and the Azores are still very much on the radar screen. Sadly the tourism infrastructure on the islands took quite a beating due to the pandemic and their recovery has been slow. I continue to monitor the situation. I'm also gathering information on an all-Czechia (Czech Republic in English) land tour (not a river cruise) that would feature a multi-day visit to magnificent Prague and a leisurely survey of the country beyond the Capital City. Our planned tour to Holland, Belgium and France was lost to the pandemic in



2020, but I'm working to bring that one back, too, in '24 or '25. There's also a train trip around Switzerland that caught my eye.

Additionally I'm exploring an itinerary through the Baltic countries of Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania for 2024. I'll confess none of these countries were on your lists. But these less-explored destinations (I'd also put Czechia on this list) represent amazing value right now at a time when all travel, especially international, is seeing unprecedented price increases.

Canada also rated very high in the poll. Don't overlook summer tours to Atlantic Canada and Victoria in the 2023 Dream Book that still have availability. Brief descriptions and pricing are in these pages, and complete information is available online or by calling the office. Those who got shut out of Riding the Rails through the Canadian Rockies can rest assured Scott Angeletti is working on additional departures in '24. Former staffer Ramona Goodge loved Mexico's Copper Canyon. Our partner tour operator who manages the train and hotel space in the Canyon is back in business and eager for our return visit. Stay tuned for more information on these and other new international destinations in future publications and online.

There are two amazing destinations I've decided to roll out this year. One is Scotland, and you'll find the itinerary and pricing in these pages for our planned August departure. Those on our 2022 Ireland tour

got the first opportunity to book and half the seats are already taken. Don't delay if donning your family tartan this year is high on your list! The second is Greece. Generally, all dimes, quarters and half dollars minted 1964 and before have a value. Half dollars from 1965-70 also are worth more than 50 cents. For pennies and nickels, generally coins before 1940 have value. All silver dollars minted 1935 or before are worth having appraised. Many of the items the mint has issued from 1936-present have

value. Proof sets, mint sets, various commemorative coins, some are worth only a few dollars, but some much more. There is no charge for appraisals for Travel Club Members and their referrals.

Have you ever observed someone exiting a vehicle parked in a handicapped space and thought to yourself "they look

perfectly able-bodied; why do they have a handicapped placard?" I confess I have thought that more than once. However, since I now have issues with my back, I no longer silently judge (or misjudge) another's abilities.

On the surface, it appears I walk with a cane, which should not qualify me for wheelchair assistance. However, I cannot walk airport distances (depending on the airport) without pain or stand in line without pain, so wheelchair assistance allows me to maneuver the airport with less pain and in a timely manner. Since I have always been fiercely independent, I dislike having any kind of assistance and am always mindful of others whose need is much greater than mine.

I know your Barber Pole comments were meant to bring attention to shortages of wheelchair assistance and those gaming the system, but I just want to point out that we can't judge another until we have walked a mile in their painful shoes.

As part of our commitment to helping you select the right tour for your interests and physical abilities, check out the Activity Meter for each tour to get a feel for how it matches your interests, energy and fitness. It's important to note that more than one level may apply to a tour. For example, some will enjoy a visit to a national park by spending time in the visitor's center and taking a seat with a view. Others might prefer to hike on a nature trail. Same destination, same tour, two different levels of activity.

The letter abbreviations for each departure can be found in the Table of Contents listing for the tour. Where you see two letters, that indicates the ability to add activities or do optional things which increase the amount of physical activity (standing, walking, climbing stairs, etc.). The meter is a guideline. It is impossible to predict every situation on tour, since conditions may change before or during a trip which require itinerary adjustments.

Leisurely - A tour that can be enjoyed by all. A minimal amount of required walking on city streets or generally level surfaces, with few stairs. A theater day trip might be an example.

Moderate - A tour with some walking activities, and standing/strolling at attractions and museums and possibly some stair climbing. A daytrip to the ballpark or a short regional trip (Monterey, CA Coast) might be examples. A moderate trip could include air transportation and navigating through airports.

Active – A tour which includes longer walks (3-5 city blocks). Shorter walks could be on uneven surfaces. Days could be longer (including longer travel days with layovers). Some of the trips could be at high altitudes.

This would be the level for most of our longer distance domestic and Canadian tours, the minimum level for an overseas international tour. Tours which mention the ability to walk 3-5 city blocks in a timely fashion a couple of times a day fit into this category, as would most of our national park tours. You could find a flight of stairs without handrails. A tour with a seaplane or jeep ride, and the ability to climb into the plane/ jeep, would be found in this category. Longer rail tours fit in this category.

Energetic - A tour with an accent on opportunities for walking and other physical activities. Many overseas tours would fit in this category. Long plane flights, perhaps standing or walking longer distances. You might have to climb into a boat, carriage or train. If you need wheelchair assistance at the airport or other places, you should not consider a tour on this level.

Challenging - Tours like these are designed with daily physical activities like hiking and other vigorous activities and can be great travel experiences, but they are not typical of Sports Leisure Vacations trips.
