Falling COVID Numbers and Rising Vaccines Make Limited Travel a Reality

After a long and deadly winter, COVID infections (as of press time), are down dramatically from their December peaks. There is growing optimism that the worst of it may finally be behind us. Because mature senior travelers have been among the first to be vaccinated, they are the first to be able to travel safely.

At **Sports Leisure**, we planned for this eventuality. Our spring and early summer schedule offers a wide variety of close-to-home tours. In fact, for the rest of the year, we are staying conservative, US and Canada, with just one overseas adventure in the fall (Italy Cooks).

Vaccine/Tested Travel

With more and more of us being vaccinated, travel for us will be safer. *Sports Leisure Vacations* has announced a new policy, **effective March 10th.** Beginning

that date, everyone on every trip will need to have proof of at least the first shot of a two-shot dose seven days prior to departure, or the complete single shot vaccine. (Studies have shown the first shot gives considerable coverage after 5-7 days.) If you haven't been vaccinated, or prefer not to be, you can travel with a proof of a negative COVID test within 3-5 days of departure.

Testing will be dramatically easier, as doit-yourself home test kits become available. Within a couple of months, all who wish to be vaccinated will likely have the opportunity. While vaccination doesn't mean you cannot get the virus, it means the chance of it happening is greatly diminished. If you get sick, the length and severity has shown to be lessened in those who have been vaccinated.

Our travelers will continue to wear masks for the foreseeable future. That could be a few months, or it could be a year from now. We will follow the science and the medical experts in forming our way forward. We will continue to spread out on the coach and do hand sanitizing. Those who choose to travel in the coming months will need to be flexible. The landscape has changed a bit and will continue to change. One thing that won't change: Our commitment to creating unique, upscale travel experiences.

When looking at potential travel in the coming months, remember that *Sports Leisure* has one of the most liberal cancellation policies in the industry. For domestic (US and Canada) trips, you can cancel up to 60 days prior to departure and incur no penalty. This allows you to reserve a trip or two now, and if the landscape

doesn't meet your approval, cancel two months before you go and no one gets harmed. (If we think you are making multiple reservations and cancelling them all at 60 days, we reserve the right to add a \$20 charge to your account, but a trip or two is not a problem.)



The Story of SHMILY (maybe one of the best stories ever)

My grandparents were married for over half a century, and played their own special game from the time they had met each other. The goal of their game was to write the word "shmily" in a surprise place for the other to find. They took turns leaving "shmily" around the house, and as soon as one of them discovered it, it was their turn to hide it once more. They dragged "shmily" with their fingers through the sugar and flour containers to await whomever was preparing the next meal. "Shmily" was written in the steam left on the mirror after a hot shower, where it would reappear bath after bath. At one point, my grandmother even unrolled an entire roll of toilet paper to leave "shmily" on the very last sheet.

There was no end to the places "shmily" would pop up. Little notes with "shmily" scribbled hurriedly were found on dashboards and car seats, or taped to steering wheels. The notes were stuffed inside shoes and left under pillows. This mysterious word was as much a part of my grandparents' house as the furniture. It took me a long time before I was able to fully appreciate my grandparent's game. They had love down pat. It was more than their flirtatious little games; it was a way of life. Their relationship was based on a devotion and passionate affection which not everyone is lucky enough to experience.

Grandma and Grandpa held hands every chance they could. They stole kisses as they bumped into each other in their tiny kitchen.

They finished each other's sentences and shared the daily crossword puzzle and word jumble. My grandma whispered to me about how cute my grandpa was, how handsome an old man he had grown to be. She claimed that she really knew "how to pick 'em."

But there was a dark cloud in my grandparents' life: my grandmother had breast cancer. He comforted her in their yellow room, painted that color so she could always be surrounded by sunshine, even when she was too sick to go outside. With the help of a cane and my grandfather's steady hand, they still went to church every Sunday morning. But my grandmother grew steadily weaker until, finally, she could not leave the house anymore. For a while, Grandpa would go to church alone, praying to God to watch over his wife.

Then one day, what we all dreaded finally happened. Grandma was gone.

"Shmily." It was scrawled in yellow on the pink ribbons of my grandmother's funeral bouquet. As the crowd thinned and the last mourners turned to leave, my aunts, uncles, cousins, and other family members came forward and gathered around Grandma one last time.

Shaking with my own sorrow, I will never forget that moment. For I knew then that, although I couldn't begin to fathom the depth of their love, I had been privileged to witness its unmatched beauty.



As Travel Begins Again...

We will continue our COVID protocols on all trips for the immediate future. These include:

All travelers must wear masks on the bus and during all group activities at all times, unless eating or drinking. Neck gaiters and bandannas are not considered masks. Face shields require a mask in addition to the shield.

Hands are sanitized each time you board the coach.

Temperatures are taken each day on extended tours, and upon initial boarding on day trips.

Our new vaccine/testing requirements can be read on the cover page.

Coach Seating

For now, we will continue our COVID policy of seating couples together on the bus and giving single travelers a double seat to themselves. Friends traveling together may choose either option. This means the capacity of the coach is 25-31 passengers, depending on how many are couples. (See the seating chart example on the right for an idea of how seating on the coach might look. P's represent passengers, X's represent blocked seats.)

Because the coach can only be filled to roughly 60% of capacity, the cost of the bus, per passenger, has increased. That is reflected in the current price of day trips. When we can go back to selling 42 seats on board, the prices will decrease.

Airline Seating

No airline has indicated they will continue to block middle seats on their aircraft after April 30. That may change, but at some point, they have to fill the planes to stay in business.


