Tours to Canada... When Will the Border Open?

Canada has run into vaccine issues,

and has lagged behind the United States in getting shots in arms. That, combined with an outbreak of more easily transmitted strains of the virus hitting unvaccinated citizens has led to higher numbers and has kept the border closed.

Canada is very dependent on tourism dollars. We think the vaccine situation will turn around quickly in the next 30-45 days and the border will reopen in early July. It's just our best professional opinion. If that happens, all of our Canada trips should operate. If it doesn't, we will deal with it in the weeks to come. If you are scheduled to travel to Canada and have your shot(s), please hang in there for a little while longer. Our tourism friends in the north need your support (and we do too). This situation goes from good to bad and back to good again fairly quickly.

We Are Using Email to Communicate More Often – Please Update Us

For a long time, we lagged behind our peers in the use of technology, particularly when it comes to sending email communications. We knew at one point about 20% of our travelers didn't have email, so dragging our feet made sense. Now, a dozen years after that first survey, the number of you without email is about 2-3%. COVID meant we lost the extra staff we needed to skip out on technology. It was time to move forward anyway.

You may have noticed we are sending more emails. If you haven't already, you

should **make sure your browser/computer accepts mail from sportsleisure.com, so our updates don't end up in your junk/spam mail.** If you have questions about this, call us and we will try and help.

We promise not to flood your mailbox with garbage. We rarely send out advertisements. We don't share your information with anyone. We don't "track" you on line or otherwise bother you. It's just not our style.

But online communication is essential. If you haven't shared your email address with us, please consider doing so. If you don't have an email address, perhaps you have a traveling friend, or a grandchild who would love to be your **"Sports Leisure messenger?"** If you can't figure out a solution, give **May Wong** or myself a call at the office and we will figure it out together.

Just One Man's Opinion by Mark Hoffmann

Here's the challenge. How to write a column which explains some of the travel realities right now, without discouraging would be travelers from taking to the road. A bit of a high wire act perhaps, we'll know 800 words from now...

Maybe this is the best way to begin. If you are a person who tends to like everything around you to be just the way you ordered it, now might not be the best time to travel. It helps to have the middle initial "F" for "flexible" right now, because whether you are traveling in a small group or on a personal adventure, you are going to find things in "recovery" or perhaps a better word is "adventure" mode.

Because things keep changing, as communities move up and down the COVID ladder, what's here today might not be here tomorrow. That could work against you, but it could also work in your favor. As more people are vaccinated, COVID **should** be less of a factor by mid-June.

Our biggest challenge right now is places to eat on the road. Hotels and their included breakfasts are all over the place. Some have completely given up, some are doing "to go" bags, some are trying to get back to the full service their customers expect as soon as they can. Housekeeping in hotels has changed dramatically during COVID. In most hotels, housekeepers do not go into rooms during your stay. They will bring you extra towels etc., but won't enter except by request. That means when you return from a day of touring, your bed isn't made, and the towels are right where you left them. Want more in room coffee? You might have to go down to the front desk to get it. Last time I called my friend **Doris Gray** of the Sutter House Hotel in downtown Sacramento, she didn't have time to talk about hotels during COVID, because she was working the front desk!

Dining while traveling is our biggest



challenge now. Restaurants with serving and capacity restrictions want to make sure they can accommodate their regular customers. They also don't know **exactly** what the rules will be by the time our arrival date rolls around. If a restaurant can only accommodate us for outdoor dining, what happens if it rains (Rain, in California?) or is windy? What is the "Plan B"?

Such is our world right now. But in a strange way, it perhaps makes our services of greater value. Because if we are finding problems booking the kinds of things that make vacations special, you can bet the public in general is having some of the same issues. This just might be one of the best times in recent history to have a good travel advisor or tour operator in your corner, putting together your travels. If you are traveling on your own, **homework** is the key word. Do it before you travel and continue it while you are traveling. Things change right now on a daily basis, and staying informed on the road will help you avoid situations which will hinder your travels.

★★★★★★ Fuel Surcharges

I mentioned on a recent episode of **The Travel Guys** the possibility that travelers might start seeing fuel surcharges. The price of gas/fuel has gone up dramatically over the last few months, and since there's no way for bus companies, attractions, and others that utilize fuel to predict huge price swings like this, you may see some surcharges. They shouldn't be huge, but they are likely to get passed on, because most travel companies are not in a position to absorb additional costs right now. I know, based on previous conversations and agreements, that we are right up against those types of charges with many of our vendors/suppliers. Be assured we monitor any surcharges and make sure they go away when fuel prices drop.

★★★★★★

I spoke at the annual **Rural Nevada Tourism Conference** last week. I just love seeing and talking to those folks. From Eureka to Tonopah to Goldfield and Ely, Nevada is full of great, off-the-beaten-track

places. We are working on a couple of "old adventures made new" for next year, including a remake of our **Nevada Ghost Towns** adventure. I'll be taking a group to **Virginia City** soon and Clayton says our Christmas tour, scheduled for **Reno and Virginia City** last year, will indeed visit those two destinations in December of this year.

★★★★★★

Thanks to all of you for your support. In April, 50 people left on two tours, all 50 fully vaccinated. The phones have been ringing and we are building trips. You'll find most of our holiday tours on these pages and we are planning **Vacation Preview Day** for **August 28th**. Details will be in the next newsletter.

Space on trips for the summer is limited, if you see something you like, get on it right away. If you are looking for ideas, why not join **Scott Angeletti** or myself and go see a volcano in July! Scott is going to **Crater Lake** on an all-coach tour, and I'll be taking a group of 15-20 to **Mt. St. Helens!**

Important Vaccination Update

We share the excitement many of you have expressed when calling in to tell us about your having received the COVID vaccine. Some of you have gone so far as to mail us a copy of your vaccination card. We appreciate this, but truly it's unnecessary. This is extremely sensitive information and quite frankly we don't have the facility to store it. Also, if recorded in the office, this doesn't help the Tour Director who is meeting you on the curb at the airport or at one of our neighborhood parking locations. It's best to follow the plan outlined in the *Health and Safety Protocols* which you'll be mailed in the final documents package before any departure asking that you present your vaccination card (or negative results from a recent COVID test) to your Tour Director for inspection at the start of any tour. If you don't want to risk losing or damaging your card while traveling, show us a photo taken with the camera on your phone. Don't laminate your card as it can cause damage.

Please also understand that provisions set forth in the Protocols are what you might call our minimum standards. Places we visit could have additional requirements. If so you can rest assured you will be notified in a timely manner prior to travel.

Focus on Fall

Have a coin collection, an estate sale of coins or just a bag or a box of old coins?

Mark is happy to appraise them for you, and in most cases, make an offer to purchase your treasures. There is no charge for the appraisal and no obligation. All US and Canadian coins can be appraised, and some foreign coins. Call and make an appointment to have your coins checked out. If you have a large or heavy collection, Mark can visit your home.

For US coins to have value, generally, \$1 coins need to be 1935 or before; Halves, quarters and dimes before 1965, nickels before 1946, pennies before 1940. There are some exceptions like proof and mint sets and special issue coins.

Tips: Never clean your coins or alter them in any way. Never throw away any packaging, especially from the mint. That packaging is part of the coin's value. Never purchase coins that are being sold on television. They are ALWAYS seriously overpriced. If you see something on TV you'd love to have, call Mark and let him find it for you at a reasonable value.
