### The Fun of Discovering a New **Destination**

After 43 years of heading up Sports Leisure Vacations, there's nothing that brings more joy to my heart than discovering a new place to visit. That happened in recent weeks, when I took



my first group to Santa Barbara. Sports Leisure had been to the city a few times over the years, usually staying on the edge of town at a Best Western, or in Ventura at a Marriott Hotel. We couldn't find anyone in town that wanted our business, and the streets of Santa Barbara aren't exactly designed for a tour bus.

But after two scouting trips to recruit hotel and dining partners, we finally made it happen in a grand way. The Harbor View Inn has a beautiful new wing we had all to ourselves. Brand new, literally. (Full disclosure, they were not harbor view.) Awesome location, with a charming local restaurant (**Jeannine's**) right next door for breakfast each day.

It was a great four day adventure, with local sightseeing, a visit to Solvang and some fun dining adventures. Santa Barbara will be back on the schedule in the spring. combining some of what we did with Hearst Castle in San Simeon. I hope you will consider a visit to this beautiful, clean city. It's nickname is the American Riviera, and I'd have to say it's a perfect fit.

### **Travel Prices are Soaring**

For the first time, the catalog was released with a number of tours and cruises which had travel dates but not pricing. This was done with an eye on the ridiculous air and hotel rates, in the hope they might moderate, given a couple of months. Waiting didn't help much. Air in some markets is a little cheaper. But the cost of travel is MUCH higher than it was pre-COVID. While I personally do expect it to come down some, wages are not going to drop and fuel prices remain high. Those are the two things driving the increases. Inflation isn't just a United States issue, it's an issue around the planet, as central banks raise interest rates and try to balance supply, demand and prices.

# The bottom line is it's going to cost more to go to our favorite places...

Air is \$200-\$300 higher to go across the country, hotels are getting 20-30% more in popular destinations. It's not just our tours that look expensive (they are), the entire travel world has been hit with higher prices. It pains me just to add up the pricing on trips. Ouch.

(In case you are curious, our tours are priced with a formula designed to leave us a 2-3% profit at the end of the day. Margins are small, so there's not a lot of room for discounting on our end. We present you the product, you decide if it's affordable. Shop around, and I suspect you will see it isn't just Sports Leisure trips that have taken a jump. the increases are throughout the travel industry.)

# A Preview Day Thank You

Seems like a lifetime since Tour Preview Day on August 28th at the KVIE Studios. A crowd of 400 people attended a total of three sessions held throughout the day. The \$10 admission collected from each attendee was donated to two local charities and Tourism Cares. Our new catalog, Looks Like We Made It (a post-COVID reference) was distributed.

When the doors and the phones opened up on Monday morning, we were overwhelmed. Many tours sold out within hours. It was difficult to get through on the phones. We have to work out a better system for the future, to cut down on the frustration many people felt. See The Barber Pole page for a list of the most requested destinations by Preview Day attendees.

### **Newsletter By E-mail**

This is the first newsletter to be delivered by e-mail to most of our travelers. About 300 of you requested a mailed copy. Couple of things those of you who are receiving this by regular mail should know.

The Post Office has become incredibly undependable. Many of you, and I mean many of you, didn't receive your annual catalog by mail, or had it delayed for days or weeks. We have no control over postal delivery. We suggest, as does the post office, that you contact your local postmaster and share your concerns with him or her.

Those who asked for a hard copy of the newsletter will receive one free for now. (Starting this summer, there will be a charge for mailed copies of the newsletter.) But know the e-mail copies will arrive first. E-mail and mail will go out on the same day. When you receive the hard copy is up to your post office. We waited almost 20 years to automate this part of our operation. While we realize there are a few of you who still don't have an e-mail address, it's time for us to best serve the majority of our customers. We don't want to leave anyone behind, but we have to do what is good business, especially after waiting so long. If you have any concerns, I welcome your call.

# You have some coins or you have inherited a collection you'd like to sell/get appraised...

In a previous life, Mark bought and sold coins. He's gone back to that as a hobby. He'd be happy to give you an honest

appraisal, and if you wish, a purchase offer, that is fair. Call him at 916-361-2051 to make an appointment. If you have more than you can move, Mark can come to you.

Generally, all dimes, quarters and half dollars minted 1964 and before have a value. For half dollars from 1965-70 also are worth more than 50 cents. For pennies and nickels, generally coins before 1940 have value. All silver dollars minted 1935 or before are worth having appraised. Many of the items the mint has issued from 1936-present have value. Proof sets, mint sets, various commemorative coins, some are worth only a few dollars, but some much more. There is no charge for appraisals for Travel Club Members and their referrals.

### **Regarding Airport Assistance**

On a recent tour, we had seven travelers request wheelchair assistance at the airport. This despite the fact that only one of the travelers used a wheelchair or walker on the tour. Two used canes.

Normally, this wouldn't be an issue. Wheelchair assistance at the airport is there for those who need help getting through the airport. Here's the challenge. When seven people request assistance at the same time (along with anyone else in the airport, arriving or departing, who may need assistance in the same time window), it can outstrip the system's ability to handle the requests. The last traveler reached the gate as the flight was boarding.

On another trip, several passengers decided they wanted a medical pre-board on a Southwest flight. Based on the Tour Director's observation at the airport, and the travelers' ability to move around on the tour, most of the people requesting the *medical* pre-board could have easily boarded without it. But then they wouldn't have been able to board early and pick out a prime seat. Could the seat opportunity have been the **real reason** some choose to pre-board?

If you truly need airport assistance, and/ or pre-boarding, we understand. But if you are gaming the system to gain a seating advantage, or just to keep from having to navigate the airport, that's a problem. Keep it legit folks. Don't create service challenges for others if you don't need to. We also encourage you to look at the tour ratings, which will help you pick trips which match your ability level.

## **Please Consider the Latest COVID Booster**

Currently, you must have your COVID vaccinations and one booster to travel with Sports Leisure Vacations. Now, there is a new booster shot and new virus variants to go along with it. At this time, we have not changed our requirements for travel, but it is likely coming in the next couple of months.

Why? Over the summer and fall, we have had COVID infections reported after travelers returned home from tour. When that has happened, we attempt to notify everyone in the group. To our knowledge, illness has been brief. So while the virus is still out there and you can catch it in public settings, if your vaccinations are up to date, your chances of severe illness are slim.

If it has been more than six months since your vaccination/booster, please consult your doctor about getting up to date.

#### Real ID

Unless there is another extension, everyone will need to have a Real ID by next May in order to travel domestically. We will undoubtedly talk a lot about this in the months ahead, but you could be proactive and check into it right now. #### The Travelers asked...

Questions you have asked on line, at Preview Day or while on tour.

I see our Tour Director(s) in upgraded seats on the plane on occasion. Can't help but wonder who pays for those upgrades?

Excellent question. Because our Tour Directors are frequent travelers, they sometimes achieve "status" within hotel or airline reward programs. This sometimes results in complimentary upgrades to rooms or seats on the plane. We allow our Tour Directors to accept those rewards, because they come at no cost to the travelers or the

Sports Leisure often offers a discount when a tour is announced for paying in full as opposed to just paying a deposit and not receiving the discount.

That is true. The reason for the discounts (we refer to them as Early Payment Discounts or EPDs) is simple. We have found, through the years, that someone

who pays for their travels in full is much less likely to cancel than a traveler who just pays a deposit. By offering a discount (usually around 3%), we are cutting down on cancellations, and giving the money to our travelers who are willing to make a bigger commitment up front. Not very scientific, but it's been shaking out like that for four

I used to brag to my friends that when you traveled with Sports Leisure, your bags were handled from the start of the trip to the end. But on recent trips, I have often had to handle my own suitcase. Why the change?

Some of the first people to disappear when COVID flared were service workers "around the edge." Bellmen and skycaps were among those who went away. But there is some good news. Recently, Southwest skycaps reappeared at the Burbank and Long Beach airports. Bellmen and baggage service at hotels is slowly returning.

One challenge is the cost. Getting one bag delivered and picked up at a hotel is now costing an average of \$10. So on a trip with 3-4 hotels and flights, you could be paying as much as \$30-40, just for luggage handling. If you aren't flying Southwest, add \$70 round trip to the airline. So you tell Mark, is that service worth it?

On Sports Leisure trips, I've noticed that often the bus isn't full, particularly on longer tours. Doesn't a smaller number of travelers mean a higher trip cost?

In a word, yes (5-7%) higher. Fewer people to share bus and tour director costs results in a slightly higher price. But it also means a better travel experience. With 25-30 people on an extended tour (instead of the customary 45-55 many companies sell) there will be more restaurants where you can order off the menu, shorter lines at restroom stops, heck... shorter lines anyplace we go.

As part of our commitment to helping you select the right tour for your interests and physical abilities, check out the Activity Meter for each tour to get a feel for how it matches your interests, energy and fitness. It's important to note that more than one level may apply to a tour. For example, some will enjoy a visit to a national park by spending time in the visitor's center and taking a seat with a view. Others might prefer to hike on a nature trail. Same destination, same tour, two different levels of activity.

The letter abbreviations for each departure can be found in the Table of Contents listing for the tour. Where you see two letters, that indicates the ability to add activities or do optional things which increase the amount of physical activity (standing, walking, climbing stairs, etc.). The meter is a guideline. It is impossible to predict every situation on tour, since conditions may change before or during a trip which require itinerary adjustments.

Leisurely – A tour that can be enjoyed by all. A minimal amount of required walking on city streets or generally level surfaces, with few stairs. A theater day trip might be an example.

Moderate - A tour with some walking activities, and standing/strolling at attractions and museums and possibly some stair climbing. A daytrip to the ballpark or a short regional trip (Monterey, CA Coast) might be examples. A moderate trip could include air transportation and navigating through airports.

Active – A tour which includes longer walks (3-5 city blocks). Shorter walks could be on uneven surfaces. Days could be longer (including longer travel days with layovers). Some of the trips could be at high altitudes.

This would be the level for most of our longer distance domestic and Canadian tours, the minimum level for an overseas international tour. Tours which mention the ability to walk 3-5 city blocks in a timely fashion a couple of times a day fit into this category, as would most of our national park tours. You could find a flight of stairs without handrails. A tour with a seaplane or jeep ride, and the ability to climb into the plane/ jeep, would be found in this category. Longer rail tours fit in this category.

Energetic - A tour with an accent on opportunities for walking and other physical activities. Many overseas tours would fit in this category. Long plane flights, perhaps standing or walking longer distances. You might have to climb into a boat, carriage or train. If you need wheelchair assistance at the airport or other places, you should not consider a tour on this level.

Challenging - Tours like these are designed with daily physical activities like hiking and other vigorous activities and can be great travel experiences, but they are not typical of Sports Leisure Vacations trips.


