While we are running all over the planet, they are here, at 9812 Old Winery Place, doing the work behind the curtain.

Tour Preview Day in September was another rousing success. Our biggest challenge is tours which sell out within hours of the phones opening. Really makes putting your name on the Priority Notification Lists a winning idea. That way, you often receive notice a few days before a tour is announced to the rest of the Travel Club.

Don't be afraid of putting your name on a wait list. Just for fun last summer on one of these Sundays, I took a bunch of wait lists from the last year and found that over 85% of the people on a list got a chance to go on the tour at some point. Putting your name on a wait list doesn't obligate you to anything. If we call to let you know there's room for you, and you've changed your mind for whatever reason, no biggie.

The post-Preview Day sales broke all records. Again. Thank you. We sell 1/5 of everything we sell all year on one day, most of it in two hours.

I notice driving around town that some of our premier competitors, Trafalgar, Collette and Tauck are all advertising on the radio, along with another company I would avoid at all costs, Gate One. Not sure what made them all get more aggressive in their marketing around town, maybe they heard a small local company was stealing a lot of the escorted travel market share and decided to come after it. Jealousy is a terrible thing. Just sayin'...

The story of the Princess of Wales, enjoyed by nearly a hundred **Sports Leisure Travelers** last winter in La Jolla, will premier on Broadway this spring. It was so loved by our first group of theater critics last year, we have added it to our annual springtime visit to New York City.

The itinerary features a day "behind Broadway," meeting people involved with getting the curtain up every night. Actors and actresses, musicians, stage crew, we have listened to them all share their stories

Diana is not completely perfect and Charles is not completely a heel. Even Camilla has redeeming qualities . . . well, just a few! Are you intrigued? What is going to be La Jolla's Next Big Thing? It may well be **FLY**, a thrilling, funny, dangerous and most definitely grown-up look at J.M. Barrie's beloved novel, Peter Pan. You'll see Neverland come to new life with

a powerful and percussive score, dynamic choreography and aerial acrobatics. Adding a little Cirque worked for the recent revival of Pippin. So you get a hot new show along with San Diego's (usually) perfect weather. What better than this to pull you away from Sacramento's winter doldrums?

Come From Away, the moving story of thousands of air travelers forced to land in Gander, Newfoundland following the events of September 11, 2001, was - you guessed it! - first staged at the La Jolla Playhouse. From there it has gone on to successful runs in New York, Toronto and London's West End, winning one Tony Award and four Olivier Awards including Best New Musical. The show will come in for a landing at Sacramento's Memorial Auditorium in May, and we've got the best seats in the house (rows A-D) for the Thursday matinee performance on the 21st. Topics of interest to Sports Leisure Travelers...

For Those Requiring Assistance at Airports

It's a subject we have addressed here before. Some of those who travel with us find it easier to get through an airport with the assistance of a wheelchair and the accompanying attendant. All airports provide this service and we are happy to assist those needing assistance.

But, based on recent observations by Tour Directors, and negative comments from other travelers, we need to talk about airport assistance. When one of our groups lands in an airport and we have more than a couple of wheelchair requests, it often maxes out the system, particularly at smaller airports. When that happens, service slows down, perhaps even stops. You see, we aren't the only flight landing and often other flights have requests for assistance also. Most are patient with this situation. Some are not. (Recently, one of our travelers really unloaded on a wheelchair pusher who was delayed. It was totally unjustified and embarrassed the rest of the group. That person is no longer welcome on Sports Leisure trips.)

We have also noticed something else. There are more wheelchair requests when we are flying on Southwest. A lot more. Some people have figured out boarding early in a chair is the way to get the seat you want. Some of these early boarders in wheelchairs have been known to walk off the plane under their own power at flight's end, declining the wheelchair waiting in their arrival city. Even Southwest has started to police this situation, because of the growing number of pre-board requests. Those who abuse the system this way are creating a situation where people who truly need help cannot get it. (Did you know you can approach the gate agent on Southwest flights and get a pre-boarding sleeve, so you don't need a wheelchair to "beat the system?").

Because the situation is getting worse

instead of better, we are making an open appeal to our travelers. Please do not request airport assistance unless you truly need it. When you request it, understand that in a small airport, there may be only one or two people to push a chair. Even in a large airport, there can be significant delays. One other consideration; wheelchair pushers rarely make more than the legal minimum wage. When the attendant is friendly and efficient, a gratuity is in order. Kindly remember it is not the attendant's fault you had to wait.

Please don't misunderstand. This is not about those who truly need help in the airports. It is about being considerate of other travelers, and patient when the extra services you need cannot be supplied at the drop of a hat. If you have any questions comments, Mark/Ramona/Clayton welcome your call. Thank you.

Listening to videos, etc. on your cell phone, on the bus

Several of our travelers have written or called recently, asking us to clarify the policy on cell phone usage on the bus. There are two parts to our policy, cell calls and listening to/watching videos with sound.

Cell Phone Calls. An example: Your phone rings. You answer and greet the caller. "I'm so sorry, I'm traveling right now and cannot talk. Could we connect later?" Of course, if it's urgent, please take care of things. Another option. If the call is important and will be extended, retire to the "phone booth" at the back of the coach. You can sit comfortably and talk as long as needed. (It also doubles as the rest room, so if someone knocks, you may have to give up your seat.) Our policy is to ask our travelers to limit the number and length of their calls.

Listening to videos: Second example. You are surfing the internet on your phone or other device. You decide to watch a video. Perhaps the grandchildren have posted something on Facebook you want to hear. Cool. Use headphones. It is poor form (and frankly rude) to expect everyone to listen to what you are hearing on your phone. Imagine the noise if 6-8 people decided to listen to videos at the same time (which is now fairly common). Easy solution. Use headphones. Or wait until you are in a more private situation where you won't disturb others.

Effective November 15th, Tour Directors have been asked to advise those in violation of the above policies to use a headset or take their calls later. Again, we welcome your comments.

Quick Reminders – Help us Provide You with the Best Possible Service

Return the Release Form - When paying for a tour by mail, kindly remember to return the form regarding Cancellations/ADA. You cannot travel if we do not have a signed copy 21 days before departure. When you pay by credit card, you must mail this document in, or you can scan it and forward by email.

Effective January 1, our Cancellation Policy will change slightly. There will be a \$20 charge for any reservation on an extended (more than one day) tour cancelled after the deposit has been paid. Previously, there was no charge until 60 days prior to departure. The change was made necessary because some people are booking multiple tours and cancelling all but one at the 61 day mark. We are hoping this small tweak will eliminate that issue.

Upgrades on the Plane – Make sure you tell your reservationist you wish Economy Plus, Comfort +, or first class seats. Michael will get those seats when he tickets the group and notify you of availability and charges. Please make these requests at time of reservation.

Traveling with a Walker? - We need to know 4 weeks before departure so we can schedule a vehicle with room for your assistive device.

PASSPORT INFORMATION

Your passport must be valid for at least six months past the end date of your tour.




